



## **Reservation in recruitment to the Supreme Court**

- For the first time, the policy of reservation for SC and ST category people has been formally implemented in the direct recruitment of officers and employees in the Supreme Court.
- This reservation will be based on the 200 point roster system which was notified by the Central Government on the basis of the decision given by the Supreme Court bench of Justice R.K. Sabharwal on July 19, 1997.
- It is noteworthy that this benefit has been given in the light of the decision given by the Constitution Bench of 9 judges of the Supreme Court in the Indra Sawhney case in 1992, under which provision of 27% reservation was made for the people of the most backward class in government jobs.
- It is clear that this decision has been implemented now after 33 years.
- This decision has been taken by CJI Justice Gavai who is the second Dalit Chief Justice of the country.
- For this purpose, the Supreme Court amended Rule 4A of the Supreme Court officers and servants (Conditions of service and conduct) Rules, 1961, in exercise of powers conferred by Article 146(2) of the Constitution of India.
- These decisions, implemented after 33 years, did not include reservation for EWS, which has been provided through the 103rd Constitution (Amendment) Act 2019. This Act added Articles 15 (6) and 16 (6) to the Constitution. This Act came into force after the signature of the President on 12 January 2019.
- The 103rd Constitutional Amendment was challenged through about 20 petitions.
- A 5-judge bench headed by the then CJI U.U. Lalit, in a 3:2 majority decision on 7-11-22, removed the reservation for EWS as unconstitutional. (Majority Dinesh Maheshwari, Bela M. Trivedi and J-13. Pardiwala; Minority -CJI + S.R. Bhatt)







#### **Hike in Railway fares**

- ❖ By Indian Railways. Railway fares have been increased from July 2025.
- This increase in railway fares has kept the unreserved class in ordinary passenger class trains separate, that is, no increase has been made in it.
- There has been no increase in fares for local passenger trains and monthlyquarterly season ticket passengers.
- There has also been no increase in the fares of AC second class up to a distance of 500 km.
- Earlier, a partial increase was made in 2019 and a large-scale increase was made in 2014.
- In 2014, fares of all classes were increased by 14.2% and freight charges by 65% National Doctors' Day
- ti is observed on 1st July of each year Since 1991.
- The day is celebrated to honour the birth and death anniversary of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, a Physician and Second CM of west Bengal.
- Theme of 2025 (For National Doctors Day) is "Behind the Mask: Who Heals the Healers".
- He was awarded the Bharat Rating in 1961

# **GST Collection: Anniversary Special**

- ♣ GST collection in 2024-25 is Rs 22.08 lakh crore. It was Rs 11.37 lakh crore in 2020-21.
- ❖ GST collection is equal to 44% of the country's total budget (Rs 50.65 lakh crore for 2025-26).
- Since its implementation on 1 July 2017, GST collection has recorded an annual growth of 9.4%.
- ❖ Currently, the GST structure is in four slabs 5%, 12%, 18% and 28%.







# Association for Democratic Reform (ADR) Report on

## **Income and Expenses of Political Parties**

- According to the ADR report, a difference line was found on the basis of income and expenditure of national political parties and regional parties in the Lok Sabha general elections in the year 2024 and the assembly elections of four states.
- National parties spent only one third of their income while regional parties spent double their income.
- ♣ In the above mentioned elections, 32 political parties including 6 national parties participated and spent a total of Rs. 3,352.81 crores. Out of this, 65.75% i.e. Rs. 2,204.318 crores was spent by only 6 national parties
- In the year 2024, BJP, Congress, AAP, CPI and BSP raised a total of Rs 6,930.246 crores but spent only Rs 2,204.318 crores in the elections.
- While 27 regional parties including RJD, SP, JDU, TMC raised Rs 515.32 crores but spent Rs 1148.492 crores in the elections.

#### **SBS-III Programme**

- Space Based Surveillance (SBS), Phase 3 involves launch of 52 Surveillance dedicated Satellites for armed forces.
- SBS-III was approved by the PM Led Cabinet Committee on security is Oct 2024.
- It involves the construction and Launch of 21 Satellites by ISRO and 31 by three private companies
- The 52 satellites shall be deployed by 2029-end
- This Project works by the Defence space Agency under the Integrated Defence staff (IDS)

#### **Prime Minister's visit to five countries**

- The Prime Minister visited five countries between 2 and 9 July. These five countries are-
- 💠 (1) Ghana (2) Trinidad and Tobago (3) Argentina (4) Brazil (5) Namibia
- During the visit to these countries, the main issues were defense agreements, rare elements (REE), terrorism issues and South-South cooperation.
- This visit started from Ghana and ended in Namibia.







#### India added in its flora and fauna

- ❖ India, in 2024, added 683 new species to its fauna and 433 taxa to its flora.
- The maximum member of new discoveries of fauna in 2024 was recorded from Kerala, with 101 species, followed by Karnataka (82 species).
- In terms of Plant discoveries, the highest number of flora discovered were from Kerala (58), followed by Maharashtra (45) and Uttarakhand (40)
- The hot spot regions such as western Ghats, and North-Eastern regions have Contributed 35% of total discoveries.

# **Chromium in the blood from the leather industry**

- ♣ Blood samples of people living in the leather industry area of Kanpur were studied on the orders of NGT. 
  ☐ The result revealed that the amount of chromium in their blood was more than the prescribed standard of 1.4 ug/litre.
- The amount of mercury in it was also found to be more than the set standard of 20ug/litre.
- Proposal to remove Justice Verma
- Events related to this case
- (1) Incident of fire in several sacks of currency notes in the store room of Justice's residence on 14 March
- (2) Formation of a three-member in-house inquiry committee by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna on 22 March
- (3) On 28 March, Justice Verma was transferred to Allahabad High Court and the Chief Justice of that court recommended not to assign him any judicial work.







- (4) On 4 May, the investigation report signed by the investigation committee on 3 May was submitted to the Chief Justice of India.
- (5) In a statement issued by the Supreme Court on May 8, it was said that the report of the Inquiry Committee and the statement/reply transmitted by Justice Verma on May 6 have been submitted to the Prime Minister and the President.

#### RSS demands review of secularism and socialism

- RSS General Secretary has demanded a review of secularism and socialism included in the Preamble of the Indian Constitution by the 42nd Amendment Act 1976.
- Socialism is reflected in the Indian Constitution in addition to the Preamble, Social Justice and Directive Principles of State Policy in Articles 38, 39 and 42, 43.
- Secularism is also given in Article 25(2)(a) of the Constitution. Apart from this, articles 25 to 28 and 29, 30 also establish the viewpoint of secularism.
- The decision in the Kesavananda Bharati case also established socialism and secularism as part of the basic structure of the Constitution.
- These two philosophies are clearly reflected in the speech given by Ambedkar in the Constituent Assembly on 25th November, 1949.

The University will train 20 lakh cooperative Society personnel-across primary agricultural credit Societies, dairy, fisheries and others-over five year's and meet the capacity-building needs of 40 lakh Cooperatives workers and 80 lakh board members.

#### Property case of Saif Ali Khan

- ♣ In an order dated June 30, 2025, MP High Count has set aside 25 year old order a Subordinate Count (of the year 2000 AD) that upheld the ownership of Saif Ali Khan and his family over properties which has been declared as every property.
- The High Court order asks the district Court to decide the matter afresh, expeditiously, preferably within a year
- The order, however, was challenged by Begum Suraiya Rashid, grand daughter of Hamidullah Khan's elder brother. Obaidullah khan and Rabia Sultan through separate Petitions in the High Court.
- They claimed that after Hamidullah Khan death in 1960, the property should have been divided among the Petitioners and the defendants the Pataudi family as per the Muslim Personal Law.
- They also challenged a 1962 order of the Union Govt. that recognised Sajida Sultan Who was declared the Nawab of Bhopal after her father's death, as the sole Successor of the Properties.

## **Ministry of Statistics Report: 51.7% employed**

- A survey report conducted by the Ministry of Statistics has made it clear that the percentage of people employed even if one-hour employment is included is 51.7%. This survey was conducted in May 2025.
- For cities it is 46.9% and for rural areas it is 54.1%.









## **Poverty in India 28.1%**

- According to the World Bank, the poverty rate in India in 2022 is 28.1%
- This report of the World Bank has been released in April 2025. It has been published by the Central Government through a press release on July 5.
- According to this, India's Consumption based Gini co-efficient of inequality fell to 25.5in 2022-23 from 28.8 in 2011-12
- The central government has concluded on the basis of this report that India has become the "Fourth most weak country in the world" after three countries Slovak Republic, Slovenia and Belarus.
- However, the World Bank report talks about high wage inequality and consumption inequality in India.
- This report says about wage inequality that in India, the average earnings of the top 10% are 13 times more than the bottom 10% in 2023-24.
- A similar report released by the World Bank in 2017-18 was rejected by the Government of India, which showed a decline in consumption in rural areas of India.
- The yardstick for measuring poverty is appropriate for a lower middle-income country like India.
- ❖ Based on this criterion, the World Bank has reported 28.1% poverty in India.
- Both high poverty and high inequality persist in this report.
- The world Bank's findings was based on official Household consumption Expenditure Survey (HCES) data for 2022-23
- This data is collected using the modified mixed reference period" (MMRP) method
- The problem with this HCES data is that it does not include the data (of their consumption) of the top 5%; these data are of the bottom 95% of the population.







#### India's claim to host COP-33

- India has claimed to host the 33rd summit of the Conference of Parties to be held in 2028.
- India's bid to host the BRICS summit has been supported.

#### **SIR reached SC**

- The SIR originating from Bihar has now reached the Supreme Court.
- Head of the Division Bench (J) Sudhanshu Dhulia, citing the 1977 decision of the SC in the case of M.S. Gill versus Chief Election Commissioner, said that "The Constitution does not exalt the Election Commission as a "low unto itself"
- This judgment states that "little, Laye Indian shall not be hijacked from the course of free and fair elections.... A free and free election based on universal adult franchise is the basic"
- According to the Judgment the Constitution under Article 324 gives powers of superintendence, direction and control over "all elections"
- The judgment says an Election Commissioner was still subject to the "norms of fairness and cannot act arbitrarily" According to it, unchecked power is alien to our system.... It is well established that when a high functionary like the commissioner is vested with wide powers, the law expects him to act fairly and legally. Discretion vested in a high functionary may be used properly, not perversely. If misused, certainly the the court has power to strike down that act
- It was a five Judge constitution Bench.
- The petition filed by various organizations, politicians in the Supreme Court on SIR started from 25 June in Bihar was heard on 10 July 2025.
- This hearing was done by the vacation bench of SC Sudhanshu Ghulia and Justice Jaymalya Bagchi.
- ❖ Vacation Benches were constituted through a notification issued on May 15 for the summer vacation i.e. from May 26 to July 13. The number of benches will be 2-5 which will have CJI and other judges.







# Starlink gets permission for satellite communication

- India's space regulator IN-SPACE has approved Elon Musk's company Starlink Satellite Communication Private Limited (SSCPL) to arrange for a group of Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellites i.e. 'STARLINK GEN 1'.
- \* 'SSCPL will be able to provide satellite communication services in India only through the Starlink Gen 1 group of satellites.
- This service approval was valid for a period of 5 years from 8 April till the end of the operational life of the 'Gen 1' group, whichever is earlier.
- ❖ Internet service speeds ranging from 100mbps to 1 gbps can be availed through Stylelink's Raft service
- To use it, consumers will have to buy Starlink dish and router.
- Starlink has partnered with Airtel and Jio.

# The country's first semiconductor plant

- The country's first semiconductor plant is located in Gholera, Gujarat, which was approved on 29 February 2024 under the 'India Semiconductor' Mitham.
- This plant has been started by Tata Electronics in collaboration with Taiwanese company 'Power-Chip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corporation'.
- Chip production is expected to start here from December 2026.
- 4 6 semiconductor plants have been approved in India so far.

#### **India- Namibia**

- In July, during the last leg of his five-nation visit to Namibia, under the chairmanship of the Prime Minister of India, India and Namibia signed agreements on the following subjects –
- (1) Cooperation in health and medicine

## **Ahmedabad plane crash: Preliminary report**

- The Aircraft Accidents Investigation Bureau (AAIB), which is investigating the Ahmedabad plane crash, has submitted its preliminary report.
- According to this report, the accident occurred due to the fuel switch being turned off.
- This conclusion is based on cockpit voice recordings in which one pilot asks the other pilot why he cut off the fuel?
- The other pilot replies that he did not do that.
- t is not clear which pilot asked the question and who answered it.
- (1) The following points are important after the take-off of the aircraft
- (2) After take-off, the aircraft achieved maximum air speed at 13.38 hrs
- (3) After this, the fuel cut off switches of the engines were turned off one by one within a second.
- (4) After a few moments, the pilot sent a Mayday message
- (5) There was no response when the control room inquired
- (6) The exhaust gas temperature of both engines was found to be high in the fifth.
- (7) After this, the speed of both engines slowed down.
- (8) After this, attempts were made to gain speed again but were unsuccessful.
- The aircraft was being operated by two pilots (1) Captain Sumit Sabharwal, 56, and (2) Clive Kunder, 32.
- The AAIB did not recommend any action against the Boeing 787-8 and GE-Gen X-1B engine operator and manufacturer in the report.
- ❖ Air India has accepted this investigation report of AAIB.
- The investigation report of the recent plane crash in Ethiopia also held the pilots responsible. Later it was accepted that the accident happened due to software problem

## **UN Special Rapporteur Francesca Albanese**

- Francesca Albanese is an Italian citizen and is the first woman to be appointed as the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Israelioccupied Palestinian territory since 1967.
- Francesca Albanese is the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Israelioccupied Palestine since 1967.

She was appointed in May 2022 for a period of three years, which was again extended for another three years in 2025. She is from Italy and is the first woman to be appointed to this post. However, she is the second citizen of Italy to be appointed to this post.

Why in discussion?

- On July 9, 2025, she came into special discussion when the Trump administration designated her as a "specially designated national" under Executive Order 14203. In the US administration, the list of "specially designated nationals" (SDN) refers to a method of sanctions that includes terrorists and drug traffickers on one hand, and authoritarian regimes, officials and even rulers on the other hand, and sanctions are imposed on them. Under this ban, the property of that person is confiscated in America and its friendly countries and the bank accounts are also frozen. Action is taken against the violator under the US Patriot Act.
- In this SDN list, the ban still remains in place on Belarus' current President Alexander Lukashenko, several of its ministers, several key members of China's Polit bureau, Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, as well as Russian President Vladimir Putin and several members of his cabinet.

#### why this ban

\$\times\$ US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, while announcing the sanctions, said that "the sanctions were imposed because of the illegitimate and shameful efforts by the Special Rapporteur, in collaboration with the ICC (International Criminal Court), to promote action against the United States and Israel. Rubio said that Albanese's political and economic warfare against the United States and Israel will not be tolerated.









#### Albanese and their work

- Albanese has studied Law from the University of London. She has done a lot of work and study on Human Rights.
- \$\footnote{\text{she reported to the UN Human Rights Council on 26 March 2024 in which she said that Israel is committing genocide in Gaza.
- In June 2025, the UN published a report by Albanese, which said that Gaza genocide is ongoing because there are many big business corporations for whom it is very lucrative. He named Microsoft, Alphabet and Amazon among these companies.
- Albanese said that the USA was subjugated by the Jewish lobby and Europe by a sense of guilt about the Holocaust
- Albanese accused Israel of turning the West Bank into an open-air-prison

#### First woman D.G. of R.P.F.

- Sonali Mishra, IPS has been appointed as Railway Protection Force (RPF) by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet of the Central Government.
- \$\times\$ She is the first woman to be appointed to the post.

#### 78%. Thermal Plant exempted from FGD

- On 12 July 2025, the Union Environment Ministry exempted 78% of Thermal Power Plants or Category C from installation of Flue Gas desulphurisation (FGD) systems
- FGD systems are designed to cut Sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) emissions. Flue Gas is a residue from burning fuels in thermal Power Plants, emits SO<sub>2</sub> which can mix in the atmosphere and create secondary Particulate matter, linked to air Pollution.
- There are about 180 thermal Power Plants in India. In a Single Plant, there can be multiple units which are 600 in total.
- The Thermal Power Units are categorised inos Category A, B and C. 11% units are in category A, 11% are in category B and rest 78% are in category c.
- The category A are the ones located within a 10 km radius of the NCT or cities within with a population of at least a million as per 2011 census.
- The Category B are the ones which are located within 10 km radius of Critically polluted areas (CPA) or non-attainment. Cities (NAC)
- Rest units have been placed in the Category C
- The Plants/units in category A were to have but in place FGD Systems by 2017 but have been given multiple extensions. The latest as per a gazette notifications in July 2025 is 30 December 2027.
- ❖ Category B Plants that comply with the EAC norms have a deadlines of 30 Dec. 2028 to install FGD.
- ❖ The remaining 78% are exempted.
- These exemptions are based on the recommendations of an expert committee Constituted by Principal science Advisor Ajay Sood

## Chinese refugees in Mizoram

- Although the movement of people between Mizoram and Myanmar is old.
- ❖ Free movement regime was started in 1968 under which movement of up to 40 km was allowed from the 1643 km border between the two countries. However, in 2004, this distance of 40 km was reduced to 16 km. In 2024, under a new protocol regarding this, the distance of 16 km was reduced to 10 km.
- A large number of people entered Mizoram from Myanmar in February 2024 when there was a military coup there. The local people of Mizoram helped and sheltered these visitors a lot.
- In 2022, about 2000 Bawm People came to Mizoram from Chatgaon Hill Tracts of Bangladesh.
- On the other hand, due to ethnic conflict in Manipur, Kuki-20 people reached Mizoram in large numbers.
- Thus, about 40,000 people from Myanmar, Bangladesh and Manipur live as refugees in Mizoram.
- The Mizos, the main community of Mizoram, share ethnic, familial and cultural ties with all these people. All of them belong to the greater zo ethnic group.
- ❖ Young Mizo Association, Church and other resourceful people have been providing help to these refugees.
- However, at the local level, for example, Farkawn village Council in Champhai district, these refugees were prohibited from going out of the camps and doing business etc.
- The Chief Minister of Mizoram has written a letter to the Central Government requesting to obtain the President's assent on the Mizoram (Maintenance of Household Registers) Bill sent to identify foreigners in the state.

  Fuel Switch
- Fuel Switches are guarded by a brackets (made up of metals) and feature a spring-loaded locking mechanism in order to prevent accidental activation.
- To more at Switch from RUN to CUTOFF a pilot has to perform a two step action lift the switch over a metal stop before pulling it down
- The USA aviation Safety regulators-Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) had issued "Special Airworthiness Information. Bulletin (SAIB) dated December 17, 2018.
- In this advisory the FAA had cautioned its counterparts around the world about the Potential of the lock on the Switch that supplies fuel to the engine getting disengaged.
- The number of Boeing 787 aircraft is 1189 in 77 airlines around the world.
- AAIB report said that Air India did not Carry out the recommendations made in the FAA's 2018 advisory that required inspections of aircraft as well as replacement of the switches carrying specific serial members with "an improved locking feature".
- Air India explained that it was so because the FAA bulletin was an advisory and not mandatory.

  Shubhanshu Shukla's space journey
- \$\times\$ Shubhanshu Shukla conducted seven microgravity experiments during his 18-day stay on the ISS under Axiom-4.

- INS NISTAR, India's first indigenously designed and built Diving support and submarine Rescue vessel has been inducted into the Indian Navy.
- \*It has been inducted into the Eastern Naval Command (ENC) headquatered in Visakhapatnam which also hosts India's nuclear Powered Submarines
- This ship can do saturation diving up to a depth of 300 meters and side diving up to 75meters.
- ❖ It is 118 meters long and weighs 10,500 tons.
- It has been built by Hindustan Shipyard Limited, Visakhapatnam.
- It also has a 15-ton marine crane, which is capable of diving into the sea.
- ❖ It has medical emergency facility, in a way it is an 8 bed hospital with OT, ICU and other facilities.
- thas the capability to rescue any type of ships including submarines in deep water.
- ❖ It was a submarine rescue vessel purchased from the then USSR in 1969 and was commissioned in 1971. It was decommissioned on 3 November 1989.







# **Trump: Five Indian jets fell**

Speaking at a dinner with Republican. Senators at the White House, Mr. Trump said that during India-Pak armed struggle (2025) (Operation sindoor as named by the Grovt. of India), five Indian jels were shot down.

### **Dividend from PSUS to Government of India**

- In the financial year 2024-25, the Government of India received a total of Rs 1,09,012crore (Rs 1.09 lakh crore) as dividend from Public Sector Undertaking companies.
- Out of these, Rs 74,017 crore was received from Non-Banking PSUs and Rs 34,995 crore from Public Sector Banks.
- Apart from this, the Government of India received Rs 2.7 lakh crore as dividend from RBI.
- Out of Non-Banking PSUS, 52 PSUS declared dividend for the financial year 2024-25.
- → The highest contribution in this is from Coal India which gave a divident of Rs 10309.9 crore (Rs 9920.9 crore in FY 2023-24)
- → After Coal India, ONGC (Rs 9075.4 crore), LIC (Rs 7324.4 crore) and NTPC (Rs 4137.4 crore) contributed.
- → The total dividend declared by Non Banking PSUS was Rs 63,749 crore in 2023-24
- $\rightarrow$  Out of this, Rs 42,908 crore was given by a fully related PSUS while the remaining Rs 31,109 crore was given by other PSUS.
- Between the financial years 2020-21 to 2024-25, a total dividend of Rs 3 lakh crore was given to the central government by non-banking PSUS. Out of this, Rs 1.27 lakh crore i.e. 42.3% was given by only five fuel related PSUs (Coal India Ltd, ONGC, IOC, BPCL and GAIL).
- The amount of dividend given to the government by non-banking PSUS in 2020-21 was Rs 39,558 crore, which increased to Rs 74,013 crore in 2024-25.
- The central government had announced a disinvestment policy in PSUS during the COVID-19 pandemic, but the process of implementing it was very slow. The reason for this is probably the increasing profits made by PSUS.
- According to an office memorandum Sent out by DIPAM in Nov. 2024 to all PSU, a mandatory minimum dividend of 30% of its profit Profit After Tax (PAT) or 4% of its net worth, whichever is higher. (Infact, the govt. has pushed these PSUs to pay dividend much higher than this mandatory amount.
- The high dividend by the oil marketing PSUs may have been caused by the situation that while the price of crude oil has bes fallen 65%. from 116 USD a barrel in June 2022 to 70 USD ba Per barrel in July 2025, the retail price of Petrol has only reduced by 1.95 Rs. Per litre of 2% over this period of 2022-23 to 2024-25.

- ❖ Dr. Abhijat sheth has been appointed as the new chairman of the National Medical commission (NMC)
- His oppointment under controversy due to a CBI Probe on him before his appointment
- NMC is a statutory body, established on 25 September 2020

# Trump wants a deal like Indonesia with India

- According to the Indonesia-American deal, there will be a 19% tariff on goods going from Indonesia to America, but there will be no duty on goods going from America to Indonesia.
- According to this deal, Indonesia will also buy energy products i.e. oil, gas etc. worth \$15 billion from the US and will also buy agricultural products worth \$4.5 billion. Along with this, Ingenia will also buy 50 Boeing aircraft.
- As per the existing tariffs in case of US-India trade, products imported from the US to India attract a tariff of 52% while products from India going to the US attract a tariff of 26%.
- According to Trump's new tariff policy, America will impose a 10% tariff on products imported from all countries, as well as a retaliatory tariff.
- In June 2025, India's exports to America have increased by 23% while imports from America have declined by 10%.

# **Stolen from cryptocurrency exchange Coin DCX**

- A sum of \$44.2 million (Rs. 378 crores) was stolen from India's leading cryptocurrency exchange company Coin DCX.
- The number of Indian customers of this company is 1.6 crores.
- The company's CEO Sumit Gupta has said that the company will compensate this loss from its own funds.
- In July 2024, another Indian crypto-currency company Waziz-x was robbed of \$230million or Rs 1923 crore.
- There is no institution or law related to the regulation of crypto currency in India. However, TDS of 1% is payable on its transactions and there is a 30% tax on its profits.RBI
- It has recommended a complete ban on it.

# India's voting behavior at the U.N.

- The percentage of "Aye" votes cast by India in the UN on more than 5500 different resolutions passed between 1946 and June 2025 has come down to 56% which is the lowest since 1955.
- The annual percentage of abstentions has gone up to 44% which is the lowest in the history of India in the UN.
- From 1946 to the late 1960s, India's voting pattern was quite unstable. During this period, the percentage of "yes" votes ranged between 20% and 100%. Abstentions also ranged from 0 to 40%
- India's voting pattern stabilized between 1970 and 1994, and during this period, the percentage of "yes" votes ranged between 74% and 96%. Annual abstentions ranged between 8% and 19%
- At present, the change in India's voting pattern in the UN is due to the following two reasons -
- (i) Multi-polarization in the global political scenario
- (ii) UN proposals have become more complex instead of being clear earlier

## Dividend by PSBs to the Grovt.

- Dividend from the Public Sector Banks to the Govt of India = 22,773.96 crore in 2024-35-
- Highest dividend was given by the SBI in which the GOI holds 57.43%. Stake the amount of the dividend is 8,149 crore rupees.
- Profit carned by the PSBS is 2024-25 was 1.78 lakh crore rupees.
- As of end-march 2025, gross NPAS of the PSBS declined to 2.8% from 5.94. as of March 2022, while net NPAS fell to 0.5% from 1.7%, as per RBI data.







## Vice President of India

- The Post has been provided in the constitution in Article 63 stating "there shall be a Vice President of India"
- The Provisions regarding has resignation has been provided in the constitution in Article 67 (a). This Article states that " a vice –president may by writing under his hand addressed to the President, resign his office"
- To fill vacancy in the office of vice-President the constitution Provides provisions in Article 68(2) that an election to fill a vacancy in the office of Vice President occurring by reason of.... resignation..... Shall be held as soon as possible after the occurrence of the vacancy
- The Vice President thus elected will serve for a full term of five years from the date he assumes office.
- V.V.Giri (13 May 1967-3 May 1969) was first VP to resign (to contest election of the President due to a vacancy due to death of then President Zakir Hussain.
- Second VP to resign. was R. vental venkaraman
- Shankar Dayal Sharma also had resigned in 1992
- ❖ K.R. Narayanan had also resigned from the vice Prisidency in 1997
- Bhairon singh shekhawats to contest the President election but was defeated. (first vp to be defeated in Presodential election).
- Hamid Ansari, Served for two terms under three Presidents
- On the first day of the monsoon session
- ♣ His term was till 10 August 2027.
- Admitted to AIIMS Delhi on 9 March 2025 complaining of chest pain, discharged on 12 March.
- Recently he was in news for criticizing the Supreme Court when he called Article 142 a Nuclear Missile

- The GSLV-F16 rocket will inject the Synthetic Aperture Radar Satellite into a 743 km Sun-synchronous orbit with an inclimattion of 98.4 degrees







- ❖ Weight of NISAR = 2392 kg.
- NISAR is a unique earth observation Satellite and the first to observe the earth with a dual frequency Synthetic Aperture Radar The NASA's L-band and the ISRO's band using NASA' 12 m unfurlable mesh reflector antenne, integrated to the ISRO'S modified 13 k satellite bus.

#### **NISAR**

- NISAR, the first joint satellite of the National Aero-nautics and Space Administration (NASA) and the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), will be launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota at 5.40 p.m. on July 30.
- The GSLV-F16 rocket will inject the Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite into a 743 km sun-synchro-nous orbit with an inclina-tion of 98.4 degrees.
- According to the ISRO, the NISAR satellite, weigh-ing 2,392 kg, is a unique earth observation satellite, and the first to observe the earth with a dual frequency Synthetic Aperture Radar the NASA's L-band and the ISRO's S-band using the NASA's 12m unfurla-ble mesh reflector antena, integrated to the ISRO's modified I3K satellite bus.
- NISAR will observe earth with a swathe of 242 km and high spatial resolution, using SweepSAR tech-nology for the first time. "The satellite will scan the entire globe and provide all weather, day and night data at 12-day intervals, and enable a wide range of applications. NISAR can detect even small changes in the earth's surface, such as ground deformation, ice sheet movement, and ve-getation dynamics. Furth-er applications include sea ice classification, ship de-tection, shoreline monitor-ing, storm characterisation, changes in soil moisture, mapping and monitoring of surface wa-ter resources, and disaster response," the ISRO stated.
- It added that the launch is the result of strong technical cooperation between the ISRO and the U.S. space agency's Jet Propulsion Laboratory for more than a decade.







## **India's nuclear energy**

- India's target in nuclear energy: To install 100 gigawatts of power generation capacity by 2047. This target was announced in the budget for 2025-26.
- Private entities along with foreign partners will be required to achieve this target. Till now this work has been completely under the government machinery.
- At present India's nuclear power generation capacity is 8.8GW.
- This target will be very helpful in achieving India's goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047 and achieving 'Net zero emission' by 2070.
- The Nuclear Energy Mission has set aside an allocation of Rs 20,000 crore to develop "at least five indigenously designed and operational Small Modular Reactors (SMRs)" by 2033.
- In view of all this, the government is considering making some amendments in the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 and the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act (CLNDA), 2010.
- ❖ India's nuclear program so far:
- □ India established Asia's first Nuclear Research Reactor named Apsara in 1956
- ⇒ India established Aria's first Nuclear Power Reactors in Tarapore in 1963
- □ In 1954, Dr. Homi Bhabha had set a target of producing 8 gigawatts of nuclear power by 1980.
- After this many problems also arose, such as:
- ✓ India-China war in 1962
- ✓ Entry into the nuclear club in 1964
- ✓ Decision to stay out of NPT in 1968
- √ 1974 में Peaceful Nuclear Explosion (PNE)
- Due to these, India was excluded from the emerging nuclear order.
- □ International Cooperation ceased to and export controls slowed down the nuclear power programme.
- Due to these, India's target for nuclear power generation was increased to 10 GW by 2000.





- The design of 220 MW PHWR operating in Rajasthan was indigenised so that natural uranium could now be used as fuel (earlier low enriched Uranium (LEU) was used and it had to be procured from USA and France).
- At present 14 units of PHWR are operational in India. These have now been upgraded to 700 MW. Two of these units have been installed in Kakrapar.
- ❖ India aims to become a developed country by 2047
- (i) India's annual per capita income must be increased from the current 2800 USD to 22,000 USD
- (ii) India's GDP must be increased from the current 4 trillion USD to 35 trillion USD
- It is also necessary for developed countries to increase energy consumption. In 2022, India's energy consumption was 1208 Kwh while China's was 4600 kwh and USA's was 12,500 KWh.

### **Index of 8-core Industries**

- The average growth of Index of 8 core Industries was 6.3% in 2024-25.
- It has grown at the rate of 1.7% in June 2025, but this growth was 5% in June of the previous financial year.
- Out of these eight industries, 5 witnessed a decline in June 2025. The biggest decline was in the coal sector (6.8%) (growth was 14.8% in June 2024)
- Out of the three sectors which witnessed growth, the highest growth was in the steel sector which recorded a growth of 9.3%. Cement recorded a growth of 9.2% and Refinery recorded a growth of 3.4%.

# **Henley Passport Index**

- India's ranking in the Henley Passport Index 2025 is 77, which was released in January 2025.
- India was ranked 85th in the index.
- Singapore ranks first in this, whose citizens can travel to a total of 193 countries without a visa
- ❖ Japan is in second place and South Korea is in third place.
- Afghanistan is at the lowest place.

# **India-England: Free Trade Agreement**

- On 24th July, in the presence of Prime Ministers of India and UK, the Free Trade Agreement between the two countries was signed by Commerce Minister and Chief Negotiator of India Mr. Piyush Goyal and UK Trade Minister Jonathan Reynolds.
- The formal name of this agreement is India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (India-UK CEAT).
- Since it covers both goods and services, this agreement is called Comprehensive.
- Under this, while on one hand the import-export of goods is kept at the lowest possible tariff, on the other hand the products and professionals of the service sector are also given concessions and facilities in such a way that the country can attract them more and more for their career development.
- The concept of free trade was first introduced to the world in 1817 by economist David Ricardo in his book "On the Principles of Political Economy and Taxation".
- Negotiations for free trade between India and Britain began 18 years ago on 28 May 2007 during the tenure of then Indian Prime Minister Mr. Manmohan Singh and then British Prime Minister Tony Blair.
- ♣ However, the concept started growing rapidly only after BREXIT on 1 February 2020.
- The then Prime Minister of Britain Boris Johnson showed enthusiasm and promised to finalize it by Diwali of that year, although this could not happen
- Formal negotiations for this agreement began with a virtual meeting on 17-28 January 2022. The final consensus between the two countries was reached in the 15th round of talks on 6 May 2025.
- ❖ Under this agreement, 99% of Indian exports to the UK will be duty free. However, India does not export in all of these categories.
- The agreement will reduce India's average tariff on 90% of UK products from 15% to 3%.
- Every year the mutual trade between the two countries can increase up to 34 billion dollars and by 2030 this trade will reach 120 billion dollars. At present it is 56.7 b.U.S.D.
- ❖ This agreement will increase the UK GDP by 6.5 b.USD annually.







- Objective of this agreement:-
- ✓ Increasing imports and exports of both the countries with minimum tariffs
- ✓ Promoting investment and innovation in both the countries
- √ Rationalizing the exchange of agricultural products
- √ Reducing non-tariff barriers
- India will benefit from the following export sectors to Britain:
- 1. Agricultural products
- √ In terms of agricultural products India exports 36.63 b.USD, UK
- √ imports 37.52 b.USD but UK imports only 811 million
- √ USD from India.
- ✓ This will help Indian farmers to access UK's 37.5 billion dollar agricultural market.
- ✓ It will have zero duty on 95% of agricultural and processed food products.
- ✓ Dairy products, edible oil and apples have not been included in this agreement by India, which is in the interest of farmers

- India is a country with a high growth rate and by 2030, around 60 million people will be in the middle class category. The demand here will reach around 1.4 trillion Ponds by 2035.

- (1) Switzerland(2) Norwe(3) Iceland(4) Lichtenstein (लिकटेंसटीन)
- (5) Srilanka(6) Malaysia(7) Japan(8) South Korea(9) UAE
- (10) Australia(11) Singapore(12) Thailand(13) Mauritius.
- Apart from this, agreements have also been made with the member countries of organizations like ASEAN etc.
- No such agreement has been made with the EU yet. The EU market is 10 times bigger than the UK market.

- India exports \$37 billion worth of textiles every year while Britain imports \$27 billion worth of textiles.
- ♣ Tariff on Scotch will be reduced from 150% to 75%. Thereafter tariff will be reduced by 5% every year till it reaches 40%. 1000+1750=2750 Now it will be available for 1750.
- \$\diamondle\* But states also levy taxes which are a big source of revenue for them.
- Tariff reduction on vehicles is also going to happen from 100 or 120% to 10% in 15 years. Then there is also a quota on the number of cars. In the first year, tariff will be reduced by 50 to 60% and in the first year, the

- It will not be available in hatchbacks because this reduction in tariff will be available only on cars above 2500 CC and whose price is more than Rs. 46 lakhs. (There is a separate quota of 20000 cars. Hence, it is only for luxury cars.)
- The problem is that in this way we are not making cars but promoting cars of other countries.
- Contracting will be applicable only for those above 200 crores.
- Ratify, it will take at least 1 more year
- America: Don't hire in anger
- If the objective is to increase bilateral trade then quality will have to be increased, production will have to be increased because people like to buy their favourite things even at high prices.
- ❖ Britain can be the gateway for Indian goods to reach European markets
- This agreement will clear the way for similar agreements with USA and EU as well.
- Impact:
- 1. British industrialists may prefer to invest in India because they can get a big market and cheap infrastructure (factors of production) here. And when the tariff on Indian imports in Britain will be low, they can export from here and sell the goods in the British market. Under the Rules of Origin, to get tariff exemption in the UK, the goods must be manufactured in India. If someone wants to import goods from another country like China, pack them in India and export them to the UK to avail the exemption, this will not be possible.

## Hydrogen powered rail coach tested in India

- On 25th July 2025, it was informed by the Railway Minister that the country's first hydrogen-powered coach was successfully tested by the Indian Railways.
- This test was done at the Integrated Coach Factory (ICF) located in Chennai.
- This train is connected with a 1200 horsepower inch.







#### **India Maldives**

- The Prime Minister of India, at the invitation of the President of Maldives, participated as the "Guest of Honor" on the occasion of the 60th Independence Day of Maldives on July 26.
- On this occasion, 4 agreements were also signed between the two countries -
- (1) Agreement for an Line of credit of 565 million USD (4850 crore rupees)
- (2) Reduction of annual repayment obligation of Maldives on GOI funded Line of credit...
- (3) Launch of India-Maldives Free Trade Agreement (IMFTA) negotiations.
- (4) A Commemorative stamp was issued (jointly) to mark the completion of 60 years of India-Maldives diplomatic relations.
- Apart from this, Roads and Drainage System Project was inaugurated in Addu city.
- ❖ India gifted 2 BHISHM Health Cube sets to Maldives.
- Defence Building of Maldives was inaugurated.

## Three new military units were formed

- On the occasion of Kargir Vijay Diwas being celebrated on 26 July, three new military units were formed -
- (i) Rudra Brigade (ii) Bhairav Light Commando (iii) Shahiban Regiment
- Rudra Brigade Indian army has converted two of its infantry Brigades into Rudra brigades.
- ⇒ It includes infantry, mechanised infantry, armoured units, artillery, special forces, unmanned aerial units.
- ⇒ It will provide logistics and combat support to the army.
- ♣ Bhairava Bhairav light Command Battalion has been created by the army as a lehal special forces Unit
- ⇒ Border security duty
- ⇒ Ability to launch surprise attack
- Shaktibaan:-
- ⇒ It has been formed into a suicide drone artillery.





- ⇒ It will be equipped with drones, anti-drone equipment and suicide drones.
- □ Under this, there is a drone platoon in every infantry battalion.

- Earlier, in his "Liberation Day" announcemen Trump had was announced 26% imposition of tariff on India.





- India has become the first country to face a fine among the countries importing from Russia. China imports much more from Russia than India but Trump did not impose any fine on it.

#### **NISAR**

- On July 30 at 5.40 pm, the 2392 kg NISAR Satellite will be launched into space by GSLV (Geosyn-Chronous Satellite Launch vehicle (GSLV) F-16 from Satish Shawan Space Centre located at Sriharikola in Andhra Pradesh.
- NISAR, NASA-ISRO satellite synthetic Aperlure Radar
- 💠 यह NASA तथा ISRO का पहला joint Satellite Aperture radar
- NISAR will scan the entire globe and provide all weather, day and night dat at 12 day intervals and enasu a wide range of applications.
- NISAR will have radars installed in it, which will act as its two eyes. Both these eyes will work in different frequencies/frequency bands (as the power of both the eyes is different)
- All the Earth Observation Satellites that have been placed in space till now have only one eye (Radar). (Therefore it was the most expensive one, cost was high, time was also reduced and it took 10 years to complete)
- The spatial resolution of radar data is directly related to the ratio of the senso wavelength to the length of the Sensos'o atenna.
- For a given wavelength, the longer the antenna, the higher the spatial resolution
- If a C band radar (whose wavelength is 5 cm) is installed on a satellite in space, then to get the spatial resolution of any object of height 10 m on the earth through it, the antenna of that radar must be 4250 m long (i.e. 47 football fields together).
- Now since it is not practically possible to install such a large radar in space, therefore scientists developed the technology of Synthetic Aperture Radar.
- To see a large part of the earth, to see various types of natural and man-made structures on earth and to get high quality pictures, a high quality camera is required. This work is done by radar. The stronger and more powerful the radar is, the better its picture quality will be.
- A US government committee felt the need for a space mission to study changes in land, snow and vegetation cover in 2007 and recommended NASA to work on such a mission in the same year.







- NASA took this recommendation forward and conceived the concept of developing a state-of-the-art Earth Observation Satellite that would help in detecting earthquakes, Thestudy of landslides and volcanoes can be advanced and glaciers and other ice covers, biomass, the global carbon cycle and climate change can be studied better.
- NASA started working on it in 2008. Four years later, in 2012, India's ISRO joined it.
- In this, by NASA (i) L-band synthetic aperture radar (SAR) Its wavelength is 15-7.5 cm and frequency is 2-4 GHz. It cannot go very deep but can provide good data, pictures about large things like fields, crops, water bodies etc. It can monitor crops like Soyabean, mair and sugarcane and give information about their growth and maturity stage.
- ❖ ( ii ) 12 metre antenne (iii) Solid state Recordr(iv) Payload subsystem (v) G.P.S. Systems. इत्यादि Componenets दिए गए हैं।
- ❖ While by ISRO
- (i) S-Band SAR
- (ii) GSLV-F-16

- (v) Launching Services and satellite Mission Operations.
- NASA has invested 1.16 billion USD and ISRO has invested 90 million USD for this entire mission.
- ♣ Before this, there has been cooperation and exchange between NASA and ISRO, for example, the payload on Chandrayaan belonged to NASA, but this is the first joint mission of both. This joint mission (NISAR Mission) was signed between the two in 2014. (on 30 September 2014)
- This concept of two radars on one satellite was first in the world. It took more than 10 years to arrange these two radars in a single satellite. (Special hardware, signal processing capabilities for them required sophisticated engineering to integrate them without interfering with each other)





- Two SARs on a single satellite will provide better and more comprehensive images. This is not possible by sending one SAR on each satellite.
- L Band SAR uses higher wavelength (30-15 cm) (and lower frequency 1-2 Hz). This L Band SAR can penetrate trees or vegetation, sand, and snow better. It will capture the fine details of surface waves and see through dense forest cover (for example, to map the ground beneath and measure the biomass of tree trunks, which is useful for estimating carbon stocks.) It uses NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory Mission's radas reflector and boom.
- ♣ Both these NISAR and L band SARS are designed to capture complementary images of the same place at the same time. One will see wide and the other deep.
- The life span of NISAR is 5 years.
- NISAR can provide information on overall shoreline monitoring, storm characterisation, mapping of surface water resources and disaster response.
- NISAR's swath (the width of the Earth's surface it can observe at one time) is 242 km (150 miles).

## After Bihar, SIR in Manipur too

- After Bihar, the Election Commission is also starting special Intensive Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls w.r.t. 1.1.2026 as qualifying date in Manipur.

## "UN Inter-agency Group Report

- The number of zero dose children in India's total population has decreased from 0.11% in 2023 to 0.06% in 2024 i.e. from 16 lakh in 2023 to 9 lakh in 2024.
- The number of such children in the world is 1.43 crore.
- Zero dose children are those who have not been given the first dose of DTP-1, a combined vaccine for diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis, within one year of birth.
- Their number reflects the socio-economic inequalities and gender equality of that country-society.
- UIP (Universal Immunisation Programme) is conducted for this purpose.
- Under UIP, 2.9 crore infants are vaccinated free of cost every year in the country.
- On 15 April 2020, vaccination was declared an essential function of health services.
- ♣ Intensive Mission Indradhanush 3.0 was launched during February-March 2021 and IMI-4.0 in 2022.
- \$\times\$ Still, the number of children deprived of vaccination doubled between 2019-21. This was also the period of Covid.
- On 9 August 2024, zero dose implementation scheme was started for 143 districts of 11 states.
- U-WIN platform was launched by PM on 29 October 2024. It has 5 major functions
- (1) Registration of pregnant women and children by self or ASHA workers and ranking of immunization services
- (2) Anytime, anywhere access
- (3) Name based recording to identify zero dose children
- (4) Support health workers in targeted planning and efficient implementation
- (5) Create sustainable digital vaccination documentation.
- Sustainable Development Goal 3.2 focuses on preventing deaths of newborns and children under the age of 5 years and reducing mortality rates from measles, pneumonia and diarrhoea.







## 8th Pay Commission

- The government is initiating the process of setting the terms of reference for the 8th Pay Commission.
- The benefits of the recommendations of this Pay Commission are likely to start getting accrued by the end of 2026 or 2027.
- \$\times\$ Usually, the Pay Commission may take 20 to 26 months to submit its report.
- However, there is a provision to formally receive the recommendations of this commission from 1 January 2026. The salary for the gap period will be available in the form of "arrears".

IIP slowdown

- According to IIP data released on 28 July 2025, the 15% growth in IIP in June 2025 represents the lowest growth rate in the last 10 months.
- This slowdown is mainly due to (1) sharp contraction in mining activity (-8.7% in June 2025 as against a growth of 10.3% in June 2024). (2) the second reason is the fall in electricity generation (a decline of 2.6% as against a growth of 8.6% in June 2024).
- The reason for the decrease in mining activities is the flooding of mines due to monsoon.
- According to Ranchi Meteorological Department, between 1st June and 12th July, 504.8 mm (307 to 100 mm) of rain was recorded.
- Index of Industrial Production (IIP) data now be released on 28th of every month.
- ❖ If 28th is a holiday, it will be released on 29th
- ❖ 28 June 2025 was a working day so its data was released
- ❖ IIP growth rate in June 2025 was 1.5% which grew at the rate of 1.2% in May 2025

# **Operation Sindoor in Parliament**

- Operation Sindur was debated/discussed in the Lok Sabha of India on 28-29 July.
- The debate began with the speech of Defence Minister Rajnath Singh in the Lok Sabha on 28 July at 2.05 pm.

  Justice verma Plea in SC
- A petition was filed in the Supreme Court by the judge challenging the procedure adopted by the in-house committee constituted by the Delhi High Court in the case of finding sacks of half-burnt notes at the house of Justice Yashwant Verma on the night of 14 March 2025.
- This petition was heard on 28 July 2025 by a bench of SC, consisting of Dipankar Datta and A.G. Masih.





- \* Kapil Sibbal argued on behalf of Justice Verma.
- Sibal said that the public release of visuals and audio materials of the fire in the outhouse of the judge's residence by the SC has made the judge guilty in the eyes of society and the public.
- Sibal submitted that Article 121 of the Indian Constitution provides that no matter of alleged misconduct by a judge can be discussed in public or in Parliament unless the procedure for his removal is being conducted under Article 124(4) and in that case it can be discussed only in Parliament.
- In-house inquiry Committee procedure was devised to enhanced the moral authority of the Judiciary.
- The conduct of the in-house inquiry committee and its report, has been brought in the Public domain, hardly meet that objective.
- If cash is found in an outhouse, What is the behavior of the judge to do with it? there is no "behaviors" or "misbehaviour" involved. They had to prove the cash belonged to him They never found that.

# GI Tag and cultural misuse

- Luxury brand Prada (Prada) presented a footwear in its fashion show on June 25, 2025 in Milan, Italy, which is based on the imitation of the Kolhapuri slippers of India. This G.I. Question marks also arise over the usefulness of tags.
- At present there are 658 registered G.S. i. are the objects receiving tags
- Unlike trademarks, which are owned by enterprises, GIs are public property belonging to the Producers of the concerned goods and can't be assigned, transmitted or licensed..
- Legal protection of GI received tags based on the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property 1883 and the TRIPS (Trade-related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rage Rights) Agreement, 1995
- India, as a TRIPS signatory, has enacted the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999 which came into force in 2003. This Act provides for GI registration, enforcement of rights. prohibition of unauthorised use and Penalties for infringement.







- The thing of difficulty is that the case of infringement of GI remains mainly confined to one country there is no international protection available.
- One remedy for this may be to bring these products under the ambit of international law (patents etc.) by protecting and recognising/granting them at the national level I
- ❖ Successful example of this has been seen in the past –
- (1) In 1997 the us Patent Trademark office (USPTO) issued a patent application to Ricetec Inc. had granted a patent for basmati rice to a Texas-based company named. After India tried through laws, the USPTO dissuaded the company from using the name Basmati.
- (2) In 1995 University of Mississippi Medical Center was granted Patent for wound healing properties of Turmeric I 'Cancelled this also after protest of CSIR of India.
- (3) In 2000 the European Patent office granted US Department of Agriculture and multinational firm W.R. Revoked the Patent granted for neem based antifungal formulations from Grace I (on the basis that it is already part of Indian medical nature)

#### **DALAI LAMA**

- On 10 March 1959, a high ranking Chinese army officer invited the Dalai Lama as a guest to a Chinese dance troupe. The supporters of the Dalai Lama saw this as a conspiracy and surrounded his residence.
- Dalai Lama fled from there in the guise of a Chinese soldier and reached India after a journey of 15 days. According to him, he did this on divine orders.
- The Indian government gave them shelter and they made Dharamshala their headquarters. Along with them, about 80,000 exiled people from Tibet also settled here.
- He kept opposing China at diplomatic and political level for the establishment of independent power in Tibet. He also successfully pressurized the United Nations to pass resolutions for Tibetan security in 1959, 1961 and 1965.
- He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1989 for his efforts for peaceful reconciliation.
- The Dalai Lama continues to receive support from many world celebrities for his efforts.
- He served as the religious and political leader of Tibet until 2011. In 2011, he handed over political power to the elected government there.
- Now since he will be 90 years old in 2025, the question of his succession is becoming serious.
- China has said that the Dalai Lama's successor will have to take China's permission. 1
- The Dalai Lama has predicted that his successor will be born outside China.
- IIIrd Sonam Gyalso (Ist Living) (1588 death)
- Proclamation of the People's Republic of china was made by Mao Zedong on October 1, 1949

- The power struggle between Tibet and China has been going on for two millenia.
- For the last five centuries, i.e. since its establishment, the Dalai Lama has played an important role in unifying Tibet and strengthening its people.
- The Dalai Lama started with the Mongol king Altan Khan (1507-1582) who first established the title of Dalai Lama for his Tibetan Buddhist associate Sonam Gyatso (1543-1588)
- ❖ In the 17th century, the Chinese dynasties established relations with Tibet
- After 260 years, the Ching army took over Tibet around 1909.
- \$\times\$ But in 1912, the 13th Dalai Lama Thubten Gryatso liberated Tibet again.
- China took over again in 1951 when Mao's government was formed on 1 October 1949.
- In 1409 Tsikhepa founded the Gelug school through which Buddhism was taught.
- The most prominent (in the early days) student/teacher of this school was Gedun Drupa who was given the title of the first Dalai Lama after his death in 1474.
- Ever since the unification of Tibet in 1630, there has been a fight between the arms and the Tibetan leadership. This fight was fought for between the Manchu, Mongol and Oirat groups
- The 5th Dalai Lama unified Tibet. His name was Lobsang Gyatso. He unified the whole of Tibet which was divided into small groups under the leadership of his army commander Gushi Khan. Gushi Khan was a Mongol.
- Thus the fifth Dalai Lama started taking over the rule completely from 1642. The fifth Dalai Lama is also called the Great Fifth. Tibet remained under the control of the Dalai Lama from 1642 to 1959 i.e. for 317 years.

- India also gifted the first batch of I million USD in agro-chemistry to Trinidad and Tobago's National Agricultural Marketing and Development cooperation (NAMDEVCO) and declared support for millet Cultivation, Seawed fertilizer and natural farming.

- The 17th BRICS declaration called for concrete action against all terrorists and terrorist organizations designated by the United Nations against terrorism.
- Trump's tariffs were described as illegal and arbitrary. It has been described as harmful for the global economy.
- It condemns the attack on Iran by America and Israel and calls on Israel to withdraw its troops from the Gaza Strip.







#### Cento Al Model

- Germany's research institute Helmholtz Munich developed an Al model named Centaur which is based on psychological principles.
- Centaur is capable of thinking and taking decisions like humans
- Such models can prove to be beneficial for people suffering from mental illness. Currently, around 19.73 crore people in India are suffering from mental illness.
- National Mental Health Program was started in India in 1982 to make the treatment of this disease a mission.

## Trump's tariff war

- ❖ 7 July 2025 Trump imposed a 25% duty on goods from Japan and South Korea imported into the US.
- Trump has also threatened to impose 25% tariffs on Malaysia, 30% on South Africa, 25% on Kazakhstan, and 40% on Myanmar and Laos.
- thas been ordered to be implemented from 1 August 2025.

# Refugees from Myanmar and China arriving in India

- Due to the violence between two groups of People's Defence Force, Chin National Defence Force (CNDF) and Chinaland Defence Force-Hualngoram (CCDF-H) fighting against the Military Junta ruling Myanmar, 4000 Chin people are entering Mizoram.
- This violence has erupted since 3 July 2025.
- All these refugees are entering India (Mizoram) by crossing the bridge over the Tiau river near Zokhawthar in Mizoram.
- Tiau river serves as a natural border between India and Myanmar. There is a 510 km border between India and Myanmar.
- Actually the Chin People coming from Myanmar and the Mizo People living in Mizoram are members of the same Greater 20 Community. The Kukis, Zomis, Hmars of Manipur and the Kukichins living in Bangladesh are also members of this community. For this reason, their relatives are spread throughout this region. In such a situation, they try to reach each other. Due to the conflict between Kuki and Meitei in Manipur, about 5000 Kukis have taken refuge in Mizoram.
- Around 4000 chin people have joined the present conflict.
- It is known that 30,000 refugees from Myanmar and Bangladesh are already living in Mizoram.
- About 2000 Kuki-Chin refugees entered Mizoram two years ago due to firing between Bangladesh security force and Kuki-Chin people in Bangladesh.

- Roman starovoy, 53, the Russian Transport minister who was fired recently by mr. Putin, was found dead.
- He was hit by a bullet, it is said that he committed suicide by shooting himself, investigation is underway.

## India-Namibia

- ❖ Indian PM reached Namibia on 9th July as the last leg of his 5 nation visit in July 2025
- This is the first visit by an Indian PM to Namibia after 27 years
- Diplomatic relations between the two countries were established in 1946, before Namibia's independence in 1990.
- India established its High Commission in Namibia in 1990 and Namibia established its High Commission in India in 1994.
- Namibia-India relations are important from the perspective of the Global South
- Namibia has deposits of rare minerals like terbium and dysprosium.
- Terbium is used in electronic goods and dysprosium in electric vehicles.

## **Trump and Tariff**

Trump has sent letters to 14 countries warning them of increasing tariffs after August 1, 2025 if they do not enter into an agreement with the US to reduce tariffs.











- These countries are Japan, South Korea, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Tunisia, South Africa, Bosnia and Herzegovinia, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Serbia, Cambodia, Thailand, Laos and Myanmar
- Laos has the highest tariff of all these countries (48+40=88%)

### **BRICS**

- The BRICS nations have rejected the EU's proposed carbon border adjustment Mechanismm (CBAM)
- BRICS adopted the "leaders' Framework Declaration on climate finance" on 7 July 2015 in Rio de Janeiro.
- ❖ BRICS share in global GDP is 39%
- ❖ BRICS countries' expected growth rate in 2024 is 1.1 to 1.6%
- In international trade, BRICS countries have a share of about 24% in total global exchange
- The BRICS countries represent about 48.5% of the total global population and about 36% of the total geographical area.
- The BRICS countries have about 72% of the world's rare earth minerals reserves
- ❖ 43.6% of global oil production takes place in these countries.
- ❖ 36% of the world's total natural gas production takes place in BRICS countries.
- ❖ 78.2% of global coal production takes place in these countries.

## **Trump imposes 30% tariffs on EU and Mexico**

- President Trump announced a 30% tariff on the European Union and Mexico on July 12.
- This rate will be effective from August 1.
- This action has been taken against Mexico for not taking effective steps to stop North America from becoming a narco smuggling ground.
- The main reason for imposing new tariffs on the European Union is America's trade deficit with the EU.

### **Persons in News**

Saima Wazed, daughter of former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, is currently in the news for taking a long leave from WHO.







- \$\times\$ She was elected to WHO in February 2024 as the South-East Asian Regional Director of the World Health Organisation.
- Saima Wazed's appointment to a post was also a topic of discussion at that time.
- Saima Wazed's decision to go on a long leave is also being linked to the case filed against her by Bangladesh's Anti-corruption commission on the basis of fraud, forgery and misuse of power.

## **Trump and BRICS**

- Trump has been calling BRICS "anti-American" since his election campaign for his second term.
- Even after the 17th BRICS Summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil on 6-7 July 2025, he has said that he will impose a tariff of 10% on BRICS countries.
- On November 30, 2025, Trump said he would impose 100% tariffs on BRICS countries if they launched another currency to replace the dollar. He has repeated this several times since then.
- Trump's warning is in relation to the announcement made in South Africa in 2023 and in Russia in 2024 in which a BRICS Cross-Border Payments Initiative was discussed.
- This means that Trump is now talking about imposing a 10% tariff instead of the previous 100% tariff.
- Here Trump has taken many other decisions related to BRICS countries like
- (1) 50% tariff on Brazil in the Jair Bolsonaro case (witch hunt)
- (2) 30% tariff on South Africa
- Preparations are being made to bring a separate bill to ban Russia which is being called Sanctioning Russia Act of 2025 and through which there is a plan to impose 500% tariff on oil imported from Russia.
- The BRICS countries have taken the initiative of New Development Bank (NDB) and Contingent Reserve Arrangement (CRA) which seems to challenge the World Bank and IMF.
- Expressing views in the context of Gaza and Iran while going against America and Western countries
- Condemnation of Pahalgam incident in India
- Expanding UNSC by including countries like India and Brazil
- Forming a new category "Partner countries" in the 17th BRICS, which is proposed to include Belarus, Bolivia, Cuba, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Thailand, Uganda and Uzbekistan
- The inclusion of these countries is a plan to have greater participation of the Global South in BRICS.
- Trade among the members of BRICS countries is increasing. In the last 20 years, trade between Brazil and China has increased by 50%.
- ❖ India is going to chair BRICS with a new theme "Building Resilience and Innovation for Cooperation and Sustainability".







# **Three Parent Baby**

- ❖ It is called three-parent preservation technique or mitochondrial donation treatment (MDT) or mitochondrial replacement technology (MRT).
- t uses DNA from three people to produce a child.
- It is a modified form of IVF.
- The first country to give legal recognition to this birth technique is Britain. Second country is Australia. This recognition was given in 2015.
- Children can be born using this technique in these countries.
- ❖ In the UK, the Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority is the authority for matters relating to the administration of this technique.
- Three-parent conception technique is a sequel to in vitro fertilisation (IVF) reproductive technique.

#### **NASA's Perseverance Rover**

- NASA's Perseverance Rover has made record to walk on a Mars of a distance of 411 metre concrete surface (longest walk by any rover)
- Rovers opporunmily hand walked for 220 metre and curiosity had waled for 214 meter.

- Lt's Purpose was to deliberate on ways to foster greater south-south cooperation, including on Joint R&D and Co-established standard, for a more equitable sharing of AI benefits across nations.
- ❖ It's Executive Chairman is Mr. Fu Hua. He is President of Xinhua News Agency, China.

# **China's Hyper Dam**

- China started construction of the world's largest dam on the Brahmaputra river in Tibet.
- The estimated cost of building this hydropower dam is around \$167.8 billion.
- ts production capacity will be 60,000 megawatts and it is expected to generate more than 300 billion kilowatt hours of electricity every year. This will be able to meet the annual needs of 30 crore people
- India is concerned that through this dam, China can divert the river water to those areas where there is water shortage. This can lead to drought conditions in India's North East.
- Tea plantations in Assam state are dependent on water from this river. This is equal to 75% of the total geographical area of Assam. Brahmaputra river flows through Tibet and Arunachal Pradesh and brings fertile soil with it, which is necessary for agriculture.
- tts construction can also endanger the existence of the largest river island Majuli.
- ❖ Earthquake situation will be created. This will put pressure on the tectonic plates.
- ti is being built in Nyingchi or Linzhi city of China.

# **South Syria Civil War**

- The conflict between the Druze and local Bedouin groups in the Sweida province of southern Syria appears set to end on 20 July. A ceasefire was declared for this on 19 July.
- The Israeli army and the Syrian army also got involved in the conflict between these groups and
- In this one week of violent conflict, around 1000 people were killed, including 336 Druz fighters, 298 civilians of the Druz minority community, 342 Syrian security personnel and 21 Sunni Bedouins.

# Steps to be taken to bring developing countries ahead in the race to reduce global emissions

- The following 6 steps need to be taken to bring developing countries ahead in the race to reduce global emissions-
- (1) Full commitment by governments to clean energy: Commitment by developing countries to the measures proposed so far at global forums is essential to limit global temperature rise to 1.5°C. In this, the G-20 countries, which account for 80% of emissions, will have to take the lead.
- (2) Modern energy systems need to be developed to suit the needs of the 21st century.
- For this, a strong infrastructure of advanced grid and energy storage will have to be established. Currently, out of every dollar (Rs 86.38) invested in renewable energy, only 60 cents i.e. Rs 12 is spent on grid and storage whereas this ratio should be 1:1.
- (3) Growing energy needs must be met through renewable energy sources.
- (4) Energy distribution must be made equitable, that is, it must be made available to communities that still depend on fossil fuels
- (5) Trade in renewable energy must be increased. Today, the supply of renewable energy is limited to only a few countries. Countries that want to enter this new energy era will have to reduce tariffs on renewable energy equipment.
- (6) Developing countries must provide the necessary funding. Last year, Africa received just 2% of all investment in renewable energy, even though it has 60% of the world's promising solar power potential.







# **Britain Free Trade Agreement**

- On 22 July 2025, the Union Cabinet of India approved the signing of the Free Trade Agreement during the visit of the Indian Prime Minister to Britain.
- Its formal name is "Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement".
- Through this, a target has been set to increase the bilateral trade between the two countries to \$120 billion.

- The matter was heard on 22nd July. In this hearing, the court issued a notice to the Centre and all the states to send their response within a week on the questions sent by the President.
- ts next hearing will be on July 29.

#### **Election of vice-President**

- Elections of the vice-President is conducted according to the provisions of the Part V in the Indian Constitution, Art 324 of the Indian Constitution, besidential and vice-Presidential Elections Act, 1952 and the Presidential and vice-Presidential Elections Rules, 1974
- The Vice-President serves for a term of 5 years from the date on which he assumes office.
- However, after his term, he continues in office until his successor takes office. But in the event of resignation, death or removal from office, there is provision for election "as soon as possible". There is a provision only for him to discharge his duties as Deputy Chairman to fill the vacancy caused as Chairman of the Rajya Sabha.
- The Election Commission will announce the election.
- According to the rules, the nomination paper has to be subscribed by at least 20 electon as proposers ans at least 20 electors as seconders. The paper has to be presented to the Returning officer between 11.00 a.m and 3.00 pm on any day appointed for the purpose, either by the candidate or by any of the proposers or seconders.
- The security deposit for the election is Rupees 1500.
- By convention, the Secretary General of Lok Sabha and or of Rajya Sabha is appointed as Returning officer, by rotation.
- In 2017. Venkaiah Naidu had won by margins of 272 votes over Gropal Krishna Gandhi. In 2022, Mr. Dhankhar had won by a margin of 346 votes over Margret Alva.

#### "America withdrew from UNESCO"

- America has decided to withdraw from UNESCO in anger due to the inclusion of the State of Palestine as a member state. This decision will be effective from 31 December 2026.
- During President Trump's second term, America has separated itself from two UN organizations, WHO and UNHRC.
- History of America's separation from UNESCO
- (1) The Reagan administration also withdrew in 1984. That time too, the reason was Israel. The Reagan administration was accused of being influenced by Moscow and criticising Israel. Later in 2002, George W. Bush reinstated the United States to UNESCO in gratitude for the global cooperation provided by the international community prior to the Iraq War.
- (2) In 2011, the Obama administration also pulled the US out of UNESCO. That time too, the reason was Israel.
- (3) In 2018, the Trump administration withdrew the US from UNESCO, citing anti-Israel bias at the organisation. It was reinstated in 2023 by the Biden administration.
- On UNESCO's inclusion of Israel as a Member State, America said that this is not in the national interest of the USA!" America described this decision of UNESCO as "UNESCO's Perceived agenda to advance divisive Social and cultural causes."

#### **Thailand and Combodia**

- On 24 July 2025, the most fierce war of the last decade started between Cambodia and Thailand. In this, 11 civilians and 1 soldier died.
- This deadlock had been going on for months.
- Two temples (1) Prasat Preah Vihear and (ii) Prasat Ta Muen Thom, built on a hill located as the border between the two countries, have been in dispute.
- ♣ Both these temples are Khmer-era Hindu Temples located at a distance of 95 km from each other.
- This temple is equally important for the Thai and Cambodian people.
- Visits by soldiers of both countries to these temples often create tensions.
- In 1962, the International Court of Justice ruled that Prasat Preah Vihear was under Cambodian sovereignty. Thailand denounced the decision, citing French maps that showed the site to be in Cambodia
- ❖ In 2008, Cambodia declared this temple a world heritage site
- In 2013, the International Court of Justice again upheld Cambodia's claim and asked the Thai army to withdraw
- Cambodia sent F-16 fighter jets on July 24
- The temple was built in the 9th-10th century
- Thailand's PM (acting) Phumtham Wechayach warned Cambodia that cross border clashes have displaced about 1,30,000 people and it could take the form of a war.
- The violent conflict that started between the two countries on 24 July 2025 intensified on 25 July.

Cambodia-Thailand ceasefire talks

- Cambodia Thailand ceasefire talks will begin in Malaysia from 28 July 2025 in which representatives of both countries will participate.
- So far 33 people have died in this conflict.
- ❖ 1.68 lakh people have been displaced in this.

# E-3 Group

- ❖ E-3 group refers three Powerful European nations Germany, Britain and France
- Trump partially lifted the ban after praise from Myanmar dictator.

# France recognizes the State of Palestine

- According to French President Emmanuel Macron, France will recognize the State of Palestine in September 2025.
- America has opposed this. America separated itself from UNESCO in July on this issue.
- Around 140 countries of the world including India have formally recognised the Palestine state.







#### **UN Meet on Palestine**

- UN High level conference is being organised from 28th July to discuss and find a solution to the Twonation theory related to the State of Palestine.
- This conference was to be held in June 2025 for which a resolution was also passed in UNGA last year. India had also signed this resolution. India had also signed this resolution. Due to the war between Israel-America and Iran, this conference could not be held in June 2025.
- This conference will be co-chaired by France and Saudi Arabia.
- The US and Israel will not participate in it.
- France has announced that it will formally recognize Palestine in July 2025. So far, no member of the G-7 has given recognition to this effect.
- In this conference, "Concrete measures" proposed by 8 working groups related to this subject were considered.

#### tsunami in russia

The sixth strongest earthquake and tsunami ever occurred on 30 July in the Severo-Kurlisk region located in the Northern Kuril island in the Far East region of Russia.

#### **Outcome of UN Conference**

- At the end of the UN conference on Palestine held in New York from 28-29 July 2025 an document tilled "New York Declaration on the Peaceful Settlement of the Question of Palestine and the Implementation of the Two-state Solutions" was issued
- In this 25 page ontcome document, those Member States of the 193 UN members who have not yet officially recognised Palestine have been requested to do so before 21 September.
- India's ambassador to the UN Parvathaneni Harish represented India in this conference. However, the cochairs of this conference, France and Saudi Arabia, had requested to send a minister.
- ❖ India did not agree to lead any of the 8 working groups formed for this conference.
- India expressed condolences on the humanitarian crisis in Palestine/Gaza without naming Israel in the conference.

- t is operated by the World Customs Organisation. WCO is headquartered in Brussels, Belgium.
- \$\diamoldrightarrow\$ HS Code is of 6 digits at international level but some countries like America and India adopt 8 digit system by adding two digits.
- HS Code of three types/products of Makhana are as follows
- (1) Popped Markhana = 20081921
- (2) Makhana Powder = 20081922
- (3) For other types of Markhana products = 20081929











# **MoU for 6 Greenfield Airports in Bihar**

- ♣ Bihar government and Indian government have signed an MoU for the construction of Greenfield Airports at Madhubani, Veerpur (Supaul), Munger, Valmiki Nagar (West Champaran), Muzaffarpur and Saharsa in Bihar proposed in the Union Budget. The signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Airports Authority of India (AAI) and the Government of Bihar took place at Bihar Niwas in Delhi.
- The MoU was signed by the Director of Civil Aviation Dr. Nilesh Ramchandra Devre on behalf of the Bihar Government and the acting Director of AAI, Anami Pandey.

# Bihar: Gender disparity in education quality

- According to the report of U-DISE, in the academic session 2025-26, 1 crore 28 lakh 98 thousand 459 students are enrolled in classes 1 to 8 in 70 thousand government schools in Bihar, out of which the number of boys is 62 lakh 82 thousand 577 and the number of girls is 66 lakh 15 thousand 882.
- In classes 1 to 8 alone, the total enrolment in private schools is 30,24,355 out of which the number of boys is 18 lakh and the number of girls is 12.19 lakh.

# **GST** in Bihar The number of taxpayers increased

- Before the implementation of GST from 01 July 2017, the number of taxpayers in Bihar was 12,746 which increased to 6,58,735 in 2025.

- In 2000, the total registered births in India were 1,29,46, 823
- ❖ In 2005, Bihar's enrolment rate was 16.9% and the countrywide enrolment rate was 62.5%.
- In 2005, excluding Bihar and Uttar Pradesh, the enrolment rate was 78.3%.

# State tax / GST collection increased in Bihar

The state's tax collection was Rs 20,000 crore in 2017-18, which reached Rs 41,623 crore in 2024-25.

# **Chief Minister Pratigya Yojana**

Under the Chief Minister's Seven Nischay Yojana Part-2, an internship scheme named "Mukhyamantri Pratigya Yojana" has been approved by the Bihar government with the aim of empowering the youth of Bihar with advanced skills, workplace readiness and leadership training. This approval was given on 01 July 2025.







- The full form of CM PRATIGYA is CM Promotion of Readiness, Awareness and Technical Insights for Guiding Youth Advancement.
- Under this scheme -
- (i) 12th pass youth will get Rs. 4000 per month
- (ii) Diploma or ITI pass youth will get Rs. 5000 per month
- (iii) Graduate or post graduate will get Rs. 6000 per month
- (iv) Rs. 5000 per month will be given for doing internship abroad.
- ❖ A budget of Rs 40.69 crore has been approved to spend on this scheme for the financial year 2025-26.
- A provision of Rs 129 crore has been made for the year 2026-27 to 2030-31.

# **Mukhyamantri Artist Pension Scheme**

- Chief Minister Artist Pension Scheme was approved by the Bihar Government on 1 July 2025.
- Under this scheme, outstanding artists aged 50 years or above will be given Rs 3 thousand per month as pension.
- In this, the annual income of the candidates should not be more than 1.20 thousand and there should not be 10 years of experience in the field of art.
- For this scheme, a provision of expenditure of Rs 1,11,60,000 has been made for the financial year 2025-26.
- ❖ In Bihar, the average internet usage per month will be 38 GB in 2024-25. In 2023-24 it was 27 GB.
- The national average of internet usage in India is 28 GB.
- Maharashtra is at number one with 82 GB and Delhi is at number two with 70 GB.
- The number of internet users in Bihar has reached 5 crore 50 lakhs.
- Only 42 out of 100 people use the internet in Bihar.
- Out of this, 84 out of 100 people use the internet in urban areas and 32 out of 100 people use the internet in rural areas.
- A person from Bihar won the title of Iron Man in European Championship
- ❖ Vishwanath Tiwari of Bhagalpur won the title of Iron Man in the European Championship held in Germany.
- He has achieved this title for the fourth time.
- For this he had to complete 3.86 km swimming, 180 km cycling and 42 km running.

#### **Chairman of Biscomaun**

- ❖ Vishal Singh has been declared elected to the post of President of BISCOMAUN (Bihar State Cooperative Marketing Union Limited).
- This election was held on 9 May 2025 but it was challenged in the court. This election was declared valid by the court.
- After the court's decision, on 2 July 2025, on the orders of the Election Authority, the result was officially declared by the District Magistrate, Patna-cum-District Election Officer.







#### **Bihar in World Police Games**

- Sapna Kumari of Bihar, who is employed in the Border Security Force, won three medals in archery at the 21st World Police and Fire Games held in Birmingham, USA. These medals are gold medal in field archery, gold medal in 3D archery and silver medal in target archery.
- These games start from 27th June.

# **Patna waste Management**

- A leachate plant worth Rs 500 crore will be installed to dispose of the garbage collected at Ramchak, Bariya (Patna)
- This machine will purify the liquid containing dangerous chemicals from these garbage heaps and convert it into drinking water and make fertilizer from the solid. This will also make it possible to produce electricity.
- The waste of Patna Municipal Corporation, Danapur, Khagaul and Phulwari Nagar Parishad area is sent to Ramachak, Beriya landfill site.
- Every year around 3 lakh tons of waste is collected here.
- Currently 12 lakh tons of waste is collected there.
- In Patna, an average person produces 442 grams of waste.

# Proposed deletion of Jasthit Yashwant Varma

- 50 MPs' signatures are required to bring this proposal in Rajya Sabha and 100 MPs' signatures are required to bring this proposal in Lok Sabha.
- This proposal will be conducted as per the "Judges (Inquiry) Act, 1968".
- When the motion is adopted, the Speaker or Chairman, where it is first introduced, will constitute a three-member committee.

# **Voting Pattern in Bihar**

The 2024 polling data shows that for every 1000 male voters, 1017.5 female voters cast their vote. Whereas for every 1000 male voters, 917.5 women are registered in the voter list.

# **New vocational courses in Bihar**

- Courses like retail operations and e-commerce operations have been approved in BA, B.Com and B.Sc.
- Students of these courses will also be given internship in the fourth year, the amount of which will be Rs. 15 to 17 thousand per month.
- ❖ It is known that the Chief Minister's Waiting Scheme has been started in the state on 1 July 2025 itself.

# 5 people burnt alive in Bihar on suspicion of being witches

- In Purnia, 5 people including women were burnt alive on suspicion of being witches. All of them belonged to the same family. A 70-year-old widow was also among them.
- All of them were forcibly sprinkled with petrol and burnt.









#### The student-teacher ratio in Bihar is 28

- Based on the report of National Education Project (NEP), the student-teacher ratio in the country is one teacher for 40 students in lower classes, and one teacher for 30 students in higher classes.
- According to this report, in Bihar

Class 1 to 5 = Student Teacher Ratio 32

Class 6 to 8 = Student Teacher Ratio 19

Class 9 to 10 = Student Teacher Ratio 30

Class 11 to 12 = Student Teacher Ratio 31

Bihar as a whole has a student-teacher ratio of 28.

# Domicile must for women job quota in Bihar

- On 8th July 2025, domicile has been made mandatory by the Bihar Cabinet to avail the benefit of 35% reservation in government jobs for women.
- ❖ With this decision, only women who are permanent residents of Bihar will get the benefit of 35% reservation in government jobs in Bihar.

#### **Bihar State Youth Commission**

- On 8 July 2025, the formation of Bihar State Youth Commission has been approved by the Bihar Cabinet.
- This commission will advise the government on all matters related to the improvement and upliftment of the status of youth in the society.
- This commission will coordinate with the departments to ensure better education and employment to the youth.
- Through this commission, the youth will become self-reliant, skilled and employment oriented.

#### Juvenile crime is Bihar

❖ In a press conference held in Patna on 10th July 2025 by ADG (Weaker Sections), CID, Bihar, it was told that in the period of 5 years between 2020 and 2024, the number of crimes committed by youth below 18 years has increased significantly.

# **Hearing on SIR**

- ❖ In the first day's hearing, the court asked questions to the commission regarding its objectives, methods and constitutional powers and also made some proposals like the use of Aadhaar.
- Out of the total population of 13 crore in Bihar, Aadhaar cards of 11.4 crore people have been made till June 2025,
- In addition to Aadhaar, the use of ration card has also been proposed.
- Regarding the Matriculation Certificate, it has been said that the caste survey of 2022 clearly shows that only 15% of the people of Bihar have passed 10th.
- The National Family Health Survey 2019-21 shows that nearly 40% of women in Bihar never attended school.
- According to the 2011 census, 75% of female voters above 45 years of age were illiterate.
- ❖ 29% of men could not read even one form in 2011.
- In Bihar, only 5.8% births were registered in 2005-06.
- 24% (29% among Dalits) deliveries in Bihar take place outside hospitals.
- In the last Vidhan Prabha elections, NDA got 37.26% votes and 125 seats. Mahagathbandhan got 37.23% votes and 110 seats.
- The court has considered the petitions filed on SIR as admissible on two grounds-
- (1) Time of review
- (2) Papers/documents required in the review
- The court said that if decisions are not taken on time, questions will surely arise?!

# **UN Special Rapporteur on the Occupied Palestinian territories**

- Francesca Albanese is the first woman to be appointed as the UN special Rapporteur on the occupied Palestinian territories.
- she is an Ito Italian
- the is in news due to Sanctions imposed on her by the Trum Administration under the executive order 14203 in July 2025 naming her a "specially designated national."
- sus has Sanctioned her due to repeated accusation on Israel of committing genocide in Graza and has criticised us policy on the war there.
- The UN Human Rights Commissioner Mr. Volker Turk has urged US to reverse Sanctions against her.

# Trump issues new tariffs on Brazil

- Trump has called the ongoing corruption proceedings in Brazil against former Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro, his former political ally, a "witch hunt" and has threatened to impose reciprocal tariffs of up to 50% on goods imported from Brazil.
- Trump has also talked about protecting the Israeli Prime Minister in the ongoing corruption case there

- In this meeting, a consensus was reached on making a comprehensive silt management policy on the national stage.
- Bihar has been demanding this since 2012-13.
- ❖ Due to silt
- (1) Flooding problem increases in Bihar's rivers
- (2) Less water is available in Bihar's rivers
- (3) Due to this, Bihar does not get 5.75 million acre feet of water from Son river.

# 35% tariff on Canada

- Trump has decided to impose 35% tariff on goods imported from Canada to America (on July 10)
- This decision has been taken by Trump due to Canada's failure to stop the smuggling of the narcotic drug Fentangle into America.
- This 35% tariff will be separate from other regional tariffs.

# Social security pension in bihar

- On 21st June 2025, the State Government increased the amount of social security pension from Rs. 400 per month to Rs. 1100 per month with effect from July 2025. In the light of the decision to increase the amount, an amount of Rs. 1227.27 crore was transferred to the accounts of more than 1 crore 11 lakh beneficiaries on July 1.
- Social Security Pension Scheme is given to three categories of candidates –
- (1) Men and Women above 60 years (conditions apply)
- (2) Disabled Persons Men and Women
- (3) Widow Women









# Varanasi - Kolkata Expressway : Bihar's first

- Objection has been raised by the State Wildlife Board of Bihar on the construction of this first expressway passing through Bihar.
- This objection is on the Rohtas and Rohtas-Aurangabad section. In Rohtas, a tunnel has been asked to be built without blasting, the second is related to the construction of a bridge over Son in Rohtas-Aurangabad.
- ❖ 161 km of this expressway will be built in Bihar.

#### **Birth-Death Certificate in Bihar**

- (1) Within 21 days without any permission-oath
- (2) Within 21 days to 30 days after paying Rs. 20 fine from Registrar level
- (3) Within 30 days to 1 year with permission of District Statistical Officer and Rs. 50 late fee
- (4) After 1 year, with permission of SDM and Rs. 100 late fee

# Fish production in bihar

# **Education reform in Bihar**

- ❖ Smart classes will be started in 28 thousand middle schools of the state in the session 2026-27, which will benefit 47 lakh children.
- Under the National Education Policy 2020, students from class 6 to 8 are to be given education through modern technology.









#### Cultivable land in bihar

- The national average of cultivable land is 1.08 hectares, while in Bihar it is 0.39 hectares.
- According to the Agricultural Census 2015-16, Buxar district is leading in terms of cultivable land in Bihar. The average cultivable land here is 0.72 hectares whereas in Aurangabad it is 0.60 hectares and in Purnia it is 0.59 hectares. 

  Agricultural census is done in the country every 5 years.
- The last agricultural census was the 10th Agricultural Census with reference year 2015-16.
- The 11th Agricultural Census is the latest one with reference year 2020-21 but its data has not been published yet.

- This scheme has been created on the lines of "Aspirational Districts".

- Now the target is to generate 500 GW of power from non-fossil power by 2030.

- The Buddha's ashes are collected from 6 places. These include the remains of the bones found in the Mud Stupa of Vaishali. Since Hieun Tsang mentioned the Mud Stupa, it is considered to be quite authentic.

- Under Operation Mahadev, the alleged mastermind of the Pahalgam attack, Suleman alias Asif and his accomplice in 2024 were killed by a joint team of 24 Rashtriya Rifles and 4 Para units in the forests of Harwan in the Dachigam area of Kashmir at 11.30 am. Three terrorists named Jibran and Hamza Afgami were killed in an encounter in the attack on Sonamarg tunnel project.
- One M-4 carbine Rifle, 2 AK-47 rifles and other weapons and a large quantity of ammunition were recovered from the encounter site.
