1 China built the world's first hypersonic wind tunnel 'JF-22'



China has finally built the world's largest free-piston operational shock tunnel, giving China a decisive edge over the US in the field of hypersonic technology. China's Sichuan-based facility center has built a tunnel pipe to test the hypersonic missile running at Mach 33 speed i.e. 2.5 to 11.5 kilometers per second. The facility has a diameter of 80 cm, which is twice the size of the X3 expansion tube at the University of Queensland in Australia. Which was the largest facility of its kind till recent times. The new facility in China could provide ground test support for the development of hypersonic vehicles such as scramjet-powered aircraft by simulating escape velocity from Earth's gravitational field from the center. China's new hypersonic wind tunnel is based on an Australian invention known as the Stalker tube, named after Australian scientist Raymond Stalker.

2. Australia won the World Test Championship-2023



The Australia team defeated India to win the World Test Championship. India has faced defeat for the second time in a row in the final of the

World Test Championship. Australia scored 469 runs in the first innings. The second innings was declared after scoring 270 runs. Australia had achieved a lead of 443 runs. India scored 296 runs in the first innings. At the same time, scored 234 runs in the second innings. Australia beat India by 209 runs. Smith and Travis Head scored centuries in Australia's first innings. At the same time, Alex Carey scored an unbeaten 66 in the second innings. Australia became the first team to win the trophy in all the formats of the ICC. India started the game at 164/3 on the last day. Kohli got out after scoring 49 runs. Jadeja got out without opening an account. Rahane played an inning of 46 runs. Shardul Thakur was also out on zero. KS Bharat scored 23 runs. Shami remained unbeaten after scoring 13 runs.

3. In long jump, Indian player Murali Sreesankar won the first bronze medal for India in Paris Diamond League



Indian long jumper Murali Sreesankar finished third in the Paris Diamond League with a jump of 8.09 metres. He achieved podium in this prestigious competition for the first time. Commonwealth Games silver-medallist Sreesankar produced his best jump in his third attempt late on Friday night. Olympic champions M. Tantoglu of Greece and Simon Ehmer of Switzerland finished ahead of Sreesankar with jumps of 8.13m and 8.11m respectively. Sreesankar became the third Indian to break into the top-three spots in the Diamond League. Before Sreesankar, the javelin throw champions were Neeraj Chopra and Vikas Gowda. The wind continued to blow for most of Sreesankar's competition. Sreesankar participated in the

Diamond League for the second time. Last year, he had finished sixth at the Monaco Diamonds.

4. Indian-origin scientist Joyita Gupta honored with Dutch science's highest honor 'Spinoza Prize'



Indian-origin scientist Joyita Gupta has been awarded the Spinoza Prize, the highest honor in Dutch science. This award is also called the 'Dutch Nobel Prize'. The award is the highest award in Dutch academia that is awarded to him for his outstanding, pioneering and inspiring scientific work. Joyita Gupta will receive 1.5 million euros to spend on activities related to scientific research and knowledge application. Joyita Gupta is Professor of Environment and Development in the Global South at the University of Amsterdam and co-chair of the Earth Commission. She plans to use the prize money to work towards implementing the ideas presented in her inaugural lecture in 2014 on sharing 'eco-space' (environmental use space) globally, according to the statement.

5. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the first National Training Conference in New Delhi

8. French Open 2023: Novak Djokovic beats Casper Ruud



Novak Djokovic won his men's record 23rd Grand Slam title with victory over Casper Ruud in the French Open final. Djokovic broke a tie with rival Rafael Nadal for the most singles trophies in the history of men's tennis. The Serbian has an outright lead in the men's major ahead of Rafael Nadal. He also became the first man to win all four majors at least three times. Djokovic clinched his 23rd Slam title at the French Open, defeating world No. 4 Kasper Ruud of Norway 7-6(1), 6-3, 7-5 in the final. Djokovic overtakes Rafael Nadal in men's pecking order. She also became the first person to win all majors at least three times, tying Serena Williams for the highest Grand Slam count by any player in the Open era. This year, the Roland Garros tournament or the French Open has seen a significant increase in the total prize money, which stands at €43. has reached 9 million. This shows a significant increase of 13.76 per cent over the previous year.
