



1. in Kochi Indian and US Navy conduct exercise 'SALVEX'



Indian and US navies conducted an 11-day military exercise in Kochi. The S exercise of Indian and US navies has been named 'Salvex'. The seventh edition of the Rescue and Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) exercise came to an end. Both the navies have been participating in joint rescue and EOD exercises since 2005. The exercise saw deployment of frontline warships from both sides besides specialist diving and EOD teams. The Indian Navy informed that the diving teams from both the countries shared experiences on maritime rescue and trained together in various aspects of EOD operations on land as well as at sea. The navies of both the countries undertook rescue and training in various aspects of EOD operations on land as well as at sea during this joint exercise. 2. Haryana government started 'Mera Bill Mera Adhikar Yojana'

3. 7th India-Japan Maritime Exercise 'JIMEX-23' begins in Visakhapatnam



Indian Navy has started hosting the seventh edition of Japan-India Maritime Exercise 2023 (JIMEX 23) at Visakhapatnam. This edition marks the 11th anniversary of JIMEX since its inception in 2012. The upcoming JIMEX 23 exercise will see cooperation between units of the Japan Maritime Self Defense Force (JMSDF) led by Commander Escort Flotilla One RADM Nishiyama Takahiro and Indian Navy ships led by Rear Admiral Gurcharan Singh, Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Fleet. The Indian Navy's participation in JIMEX 23 includes notable ships such as INS Delhi, the country's first indigenously built guided missile destroyer, INS Kamorta, an indigenous anti-submarine warfare corvette, fleet tanker INS Shakti, a submarine, as well as the maritime patrol aircraft P8I. dornier aircraft, Ship-

borne helicopters and fighter aircraft. JIMEX 23 will run for six days and will consist of two phases. Will be held in Visakhapatnam and will include professional, sports and social contacts.

4. Bihar launches 'Gandak-Ganga River Link Scheme'



The Bihar government has decided to link Ganga and Gandak under the river linking scheme. To reduce the effect of flood of Gandak river, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has prepared a very ambitious plan to connect Gandak and Ganga river through Chhadi and Gandaki Mahi. After passing the proposal from the cabinet, on the instructions of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, the Water Resources Department has started working on this scheme. Under this, on the instructions of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Minister of Water Resources Department Sanjay Jha along with his departmental officers went to Hirapakad (Gopalganj) to inspect the origin of this river linking scheme and took feedback from the residents. That under the Gandak-Ganga river link scheme, a total of 170 km long link channel is to be constructed starting from Gandak river near Hirapakad (Gopalganj) to river Ganga near Haispur (Saran). There is immense joy among the residents of the area after getting the approval of this scheme.

5. India's first chatbot dedicated to mental health 'Tele-Manas' launched in J&K



In view of the increasing number of mental patients in Jammu and Kashmir, it is a good step to start Tele Manas Chat-Baat facility by the Department of Health and Medical Education. With this, any person will be able to get consultation from psychiatrists. Not only this, to overcome the shortage of psychiatrists, it has also set a milestone by signing an MoU with the National Institute of Mental Sciences. That there is a huge shortage of psychiatric specialists in Jammu and Kashmir. Except for the psychiatric hospitals in Jammu and Srinagar, there are hardly any specialists even in the district hospitals. Even before this, an attempt was made to train medical officers and post them on the posts of psychiatrists, but due to lack of seriousness in this, it could not be successful. Like other parts of the country, the way mental diseases have increased in Jammu and Kashmir, from youth to others.

6. 67th convention of Travel Agent Association of India begins in Colombo



The Travel Agents Association of India (TAAI) on Thursday announced that its long-awaited convention in Sri Lanka has finally been conceptualized and will take place in Colombo from July 6-9, 2023. Making the

announcement at a virtual press conference, the travel trade association also revealed the theme of its flagship event. 'Crossing Boundaries - Changing Lives.' Focusing on promoting regional tourism between India and Sri Lanka. The Travel Trade Association, which was to host its conference in Sri Lanka last year and later postponed it due to political unrest, is expecting to take around 500 delegates to the island nation. TAAI's 67th convention is being organized in association with the Sri Lanka Association of Inbound Tour Operators (SLAITO) and in collaboration with the Sri Lankan Tourism Promotion Board (SLTPB).

7. Odisha CM launches 'Ekamra Project' for redevelopment of 11th century Lingaraj Temple



As part of his government's effort to develop ancient temples, Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Wednesday laid the foundation stone of the Rs 280crore Ekamra project for the development of areas around the 11th-century Lingaraj temple Bhubaneswar. Under the Ekamra Kshetra (ancient name Bhubaneswar) Amenities and Monuments Renovation Action (EKAMRA) scheme launched in 2019, the Naveen Patnaik government plans to develop around 80 acres of land around the ancient temple of Lord Shiva. The plan includes conservation of various other ancient temples, sacred ponds and water bodies associated with the 11th-century temple, and creating facilities for pilgrims visiting the temple. In the first phase, the focus is on creating a 12-metre wide mixed traffic lane to restore architectural and archaeological heritage sites and improve vehicular movement. parking facilities.

8. Bangladesh captain Tamim Iqbal announces retirement



Bangladesh's ODI captain Tamim Iqbal has announced his sudden retirement from international cricket three months before the team's ODI World Cup campaign begins in India. The 34-year-old was in tears as he announced his decision to end his 16-year international career. He played 70 Test matches for Bangladesh and scored 5134 runs at an average of 38.89, including 10 centuries. He last played in this format against Ireland in April. As far as ODIs are concerned, he played 241 matches and scored 36. Scored 8313 runs at an average of 62 with 14 centuries and 56 fifties. Tamim also finished his career as the highest run-scorer for Bangladesh in ODIs. Tamim was also a part of the Bangladesh team that defeated India in the 2007 World Cup. The left-handed batsman scored a match-winning half-century while chasing the target. The experienced left-hander scored 5,134 runs in 134 innings of 70 Tests, including 10 hundreds. He has retired from Twenty20 International in 2022.
