1. Russia made a super powerful missile with nuclear energy



Russian President Putin has announced that Russia has successfully tested a new generation of nuclear-powered cruise missiles. The development of Burevestnik was announced by President Putin in March 2018. It was announced as part of a broader initiative to develop intercontinental and hypersonic missiles. These included Kinjal ballistic missile and Avangard hypersonic glide vehicle. Putin told the Federal Assembly in March 2018 that the weapon aims to ensure balance in the world for decades. Putin had then said that it is a low-flying stealth missile carrying a nuclear warhead, with unlimited range, unpredictable trajectory and the ability to bypass obstacles. However, Western analysts say the program is in trouble due to several failed tests. The Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI) quoted a report in 2019 as saying that 13 tests had been conducted, with partial success in two. NTI quoted Russian military expert Alexey Leonkov as saying that it is a weapon to respond to missile attacks. Western media has described this Russian missile as a flying Chernobyl. A major nuclear accident occurred in the city of Chernobyl during Soviet times. The Russian President said that no one in their senses would think of launching a nuclear attack on Russia. He said, 'Hundreds of our missiles will be in the air simultaneously, which will not give any chance to any enemy to survive.' According to a report, Russia has a stockpile of more than 6000 nuclear weapons.

In 2021, Ambai received the Sahitya Akademi award for her notable collection of short stories titled Sivappu Kazhuthudan Oru Pachaiparavai (A Red Necked Green Bird). Ambai's academic journey led her to study history during her post-graduation at Madras Christian College. He later earned a doctoral degree from the prestigious Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Delhi, where he deepened his understanding of literature and culture. Throughout his career, he primarily focused on the art of short story writing, and enthralled readers with his concise but profound narratives. Born in Coimbatore in 1944, Lakshmi's academic interests took her to Bangalore and Madras Universities for her undergraduate and postgraduate studies. He later completed his doctoral studies from JNU in Delhi. His career began as a teacher in schools and colleges, where he combined his passion for teaching with his dedication to research and writing.

5. India elected President of AIBD for the third consecutive time



India has once again got the opportunity to lead the Asia-Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development (AIBD) General Conference (GC). India has been elected Chair of AIBD-GC for the third consecutive term. Earlier, India has already served two terms as the President of AIBD-GC from 2018-2021 and 2021-2023. Expressing his views on this significant achievement, Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting said that this is the first time in the history of AIBD, a 50 year old organization and it also reflects the confidence of broadcasting organizations across Asia-Pacific. He said that the world is expressing confidence in India that India can provide leadership in this direction besides paving the way to provide a new dimension to broadcasting. AIBD is a specialized regional inter-governmental organization established in 1977 under the auspices of UNESCO. This organization currently has 92 member organizations from 44 countries, which includes 26 government members (countries), represented by 48 broadcasting authorities and broadcasters and 44 affiliates (organizations). They represent 28 countries and territories from Asia, the Pacific, Europe, Africa, the Arab States and North America. India is one of the founding members of AIBD and India's public service broadcaster, Prasar Bharati is a representative body of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting of the Government of India in AIBD. The 21st General Conference of the Asia-Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development (AIBD) and its associated meetings 2023 (GC 2023) was chaired by Gaurav Dwivedi, President of AIBD and Chief Executive Officer of Prasar Bharati and concluded from 02 to 04 October. It took place in Port Louis, Mauritius in 2023. The two-day conference aims to create a vibrant and cohesive electronic media environment in the Asia-Pacific region through policy and resource development. After Shivraj's announcement, the General Administration Department has issued a notification. After this decision, women will now get 35 percent reservation in direct recruitment. For this, Madhya Pradesh Civil Services (Special

Provisions for Appointment of Women) Rules 1997 have been amended. The formula of 35% reservation will be applicable in all departments except Forest Department. This is being considered as another big step of the government towards making women empowered and self-reliant. Quota for women in government jobs has been fixed after the order of the Chief Minister. Even before this, CM Shivraj Singh Chauhan has made important announcements for women. Under the Ladli Brahmin Yojana, Shivraj government sends Rs 1500 to the women's account. Shivraj Singh Chauhan has already said that this amount will be increased in future and it can go up to Rs 3000 per month. He said that the stages The money under this scheme will be increased. The government has introduced amendments to the Madhya Pradesh Civil Services (Special Provisions for Appointment of Women) Rules, 1997, to provide 35 per cent reservation for women in the state. Due to which now 35% government jobs at the level of direct recruitment in Madhya Pradesh will be reserved for women.

8. Veteran Communist Party leader Anathalvattom Anandan passes away



Senior CPI(M) leader and former MLA Anathalvattom Anandan, who played a key role in building the trade union base for the party in the state, died in a hospital on Thursday. He was 86 years old. Anandan died while he was undergoing treatment at the Government Medical College Hospital, Kerala for a prolonged illness. Anathalvattom Anandan was born in 1937 in Varkala in Thiruvananthapuram district. His journey into the world of politics began in 1954 when he actively participated in a movement advocating higher wages for coir workers in his village. This early involvement laid the foundation for his lifelong dedication to the welfare of the working class. In 1956, Anandan became a member of the undivided Communist Party of India (CPI) and remained steadfast even after the split of the party in 1964. His commitment to the principles of communism and his passion for workers' rights were unwavering. Anandan's importance in the political scene of Kerala was primarily attributed to his role in building the trade union base for the Communist Party of India (Marxist) – CPI(M). His tireless efforts and dedication to the cause of the working class played an important role in strengthening the party's presence in the state. As State President of the Center of Indian Trade Union (CITU), Anandan led several movements and campaigns advocating for the rights of workers in both the organized and unorganized sectors. His leadership and ability to mobilize workers significantly contributed to the growth of CPI(M) in Kerala. Anathalvattom Anandan was not just a trade union leader; He was also a respected MLA. He was elected to the state assembly three
