

1. Aishwarya Pratap Singh Tomar won gold medal in 50 meter rifle 3P event.



At the 2023 Asian Shooting Championships, Aishwarya Pratap Singh Tomar won the gold medal in the 50m rifle 3P event with a final score of 463.5, defeating China's Tian Jiaming. Aishwarya Pratap Singh Tomar won the gold medal in the men's 50m rifle 3 positions event at the Asian Shooting Championships 2023. Tomar's impressive score of 463.5 in the final secured the top spot, making him the most successful Indian shooter in the event. Tian Jiaming of the People's Republic of China took the silver medal with 462.7 points, while his fellow countryman Du Linshu won the bronze medal with 450.3 points. During the qualification round, Aishwarya Pratap Singh Tomar was the only Indian shooter to make the top eight, finishing fifth with a score of 591. His teammates Akhil Sheoran and Swapnil Kusale contributed to India's success by finishing ninth and eleventh with scores of 587 and 586 respectively. The result of this collective effort was that the Indian team won the silver medal in the team event. Asian Shooting Championship 2023 proved to be an important event for Indian shooting sports. performances from senior Indian shooters contributed to India's total medal tally of 55, which includes 21 gold, 21 silver and 13 bronze medals. In comparison, China emerged as the leading country with 76 medals, including 33 gold. India's successful performance at the championship also meant securing a valuable Olympic quota. Notable Indian shooters like Shriyanka Sadangi, Anish Bhanwala, Manu Bhaker, Arjun Babuta, Tillotama Sen and Sarabjot Singh secured Paris Olympic quotas, contributing to India's total of 13 Olympic quota places in shooting for the Paris 2024 Olympics. Although securing an Olympic quota is a significant achievement, the final decision on an athlete's participation at the Paris Games rests with the respective National Olympic Committees (NOCs). The athletes who have secured

quota for India will eagerly wait for the selection of their NOC for representation at Paris 2024. To further encourage these athletes, the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) has announced a bonus point in the national trials scheduled for next year.

2. PM Modi gave a gift of Rs 5,950 crore to Gujarat

4. Output of eight infrastructure sectors increased by 8.1% in September



According to the data of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, the growth rate of eight basic industries (ICIs) of the country in September was 8.1 percent on an annual basis. There was an increase of 12.1% in August. The data shows that the ICI grew by 7.8 per cent yearon-year between April and September 2023-24. The statement said that the production of coal, steel, electricity, natural gas, refinery products, cement and fertilizers recorded positive growth in September 2023 compared to the same month last year. Coal sector output grew by 16.1 percent in September 2023, up from 12.1 percent in the same month a year ago, but it remained lower than the 17.9 percent output in August 2023. Crude oil sector production declined marginally by 0.4 per cent, compared to a 2.3 per cent decline in September 2022. The production of this sector had increased by 2.1 percent in August 2023. Production of natural gas and refinery products increased by 6.5 percent and 5.5 percent respectively in September 2023. Fertilizer production increased by 4.2 per cent while that of steel and cement sectors increased by 9.6 per cent and 4.7 per cent respectively. Power sector

output declined from 15.3 percent in August 2023 to 9.3 percent in September 2023. The ICI measures the combined and individual performance of the output of eight major industries including coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertilizers, steel, cement and electricity. The share of eight basic industries in the weightage of goods included in the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) is 40.27 percent.

5. UNESCO: Kozhikode included in the list of 'City of Literature ' and Gwalior in the list of 'City of Music'



Gwalior and Kozhikode of India are among the 55 new cities which have been included in the list of UNESCO's Creative Cities Network. The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) announced this on its official website. According to a statement issued by UNESCO, these new cities were included in the list for their strong commitment to using culture and creativity as part of their development strategies and demonstrating innovative practices in human-centred urban planning. Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's daughter Saima Wajed, a mental health expert, has been named as the next regional director of the South-East Asia region of the World Health Organization (WHO). Senior WHO official Dr. Shambhu Prasad Acharya was the second candidate. He was nominated by Nepal. During a closed meeting at the 76th session of the WHO Regional Committee for the South-East Asia region, member states voted to nominate Wajed to the post. According to a statement from the world health body, the nomination will be presented to the WHO Executive Board during its 154th session to be held in Geneva, Switzerland from January 22 to 27 next year. Wajed will assume charge on February 1, 2024. Bangladesh's Foreign Ministry said in a statement that the newly appointed regional director will assume charge on February 1, 2024. Saima will hold this post from 2024 to 2028. Let us tell you that before this election, Saima Wajed had visited India and Indonesia. Saima had come to India with her mother Sheikh Hasina for the recently held G20 Summit. During this time he also met PM Modi. Eight votes were cast in favor of

Wajed, who is going to hold the charge of Regional Director for four years, while her close contestant Dr. Shambhu Prasad Acharya had to be content with only two votes. It is believed that India played an important role in Wazed's victory because he had traveled to India and Indonesia before voting.
