

1. Finance Minister inaugurates State Bank of India branch in Sri Lanka



Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman visited Sri Lanka's eastern port city of Trincomalee where she launched a branch of the State Bank of India and praised its role in helping companies in international trade. Sitharaman, who is on a three-day visit to Sri Lanka, visited the main Hindu temple in the multi-ethnic city before inaugurating the State Bank of India branch in Trincomalee. Eastern Province Governor Senthil Thondaman, India's High Commissioner to Sri Lanka Gopal Baglay and SBI Chairman Dinesh Khara were also present at the inauguration. After inaugurating the branch, Sitharaman appreciated that SBI, with its significant presence of 159 years, is the oldest bank in Sri Lanka and is expanding its business in the country and abroad. During the Sri Lankan economic crisis, SBI's presence in Sri Lanka paved the way for the smooth extension of a USD 1 billion line of credit by India to Sri Lanka. Furthermore, SBI Sri Lanka is playing an important role by supporting corporates in international trade. In addition to SBI in-branch operations in Sri Lanka, SBI Sri Lanka continues to grow remittances through a robust digital platform through the YONO app and online banking. Sitharaman later also visited the Lanka Indian Oil Company complex in the port city. Along with Sitharaman's visit to Sri Lanka, the two countries also discussed the 12th round of the Economic and Technological Cooperation Agreement (ETCA), which was stalled since 2018. The talks took place from October 30 to November 1 following the visit of Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe to Delhi in late July. Both Wickremesinghe and Prime Minister Narendra Modi had agreed to increase bilateral trade and investment. The 12th round covered a range of topics including goods, services, rules of origin, trade

treatment, customs procedures and trade facilitation, technical barriers to trade and more, a press release said. The 19-member Indian official delegation was led by Anant Swarup, chief negotiator and joint secretary of the Department of Commerce and Industry of India.

2. Kerala to launch multilingual microsite to promote religious tourism

Located in the Pathanamthitta district, this microsite dedicated to the hill-temple strives to be a complete resource for the pilgrims who make all the efforts to travel and reach the Ayyappa temple every year. Its primary objective is to enhance the overall pilgrimage experience and facilitate a smoother, more organized journey for these pilgrims. The revised microsite, apart from providing comprehensive information about travel routes, will also provide valuable insights into the transport options and accommodation facilities available near the temples. Furthermore, it will be a valuable source for the latest updates on Sabarimala darshan, providing more information about the unique geographical features of the hill-temple and its deeply rooted cultural traditions. This will be particularly beneficial for potential pilgrims, allowing them to easily plan their itineraries. The Kerala Tourism Department,

after obtaining necessary approvals from the concerned working group, has allocated a substantial amount of Rs 61.36 lakh for the development and maintenance of the Sabarimala microsite. Additionally, Kerala Tourism is preparing to launch another microsite with a unique focus on the state's Islamic traditions, festivals, art forms and places of worship. The initiative is part of a larger digital project that comes with a budget of Rs 93.81 lakh. The objective of the department here is to contribute to the promotion and support of pilgrimage tourism within the state.

3. Workshop on India - AU cooperation organized by NITI Aayog



NITI Aayog and Observer Research Foundation organized a workshop in New Delhi focusing on India-AU cooperation in line with the New Delhi Leaders Declaration, NITI Aayog, in partnership with Observer Research Foundation (ORF), organized a workshop in New Delhi focused on implementing the commitments of the New Delhi Leaders Declaration (NDLD) signed at the recent G-20 Summit. 4. India 's first international cruise liner ' Costa Serena ' departs from Mumbai

5. EESL launches ' National Skilled Cooking Programme ' to transform cooking practices in India



EESL unveiled two ground-breaking initiatives, National Efficient Cooking Program (NECP) and Energy Efficient aims to bring Program (EEFP), which unprecedented change in cooking practices in India. Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL), a Joint Venture of Public Sector Undertakings under the Ministry of Power, unveiled two unprecedented initiatives, National Efficient Cooking Program (NECP) and Energy Efficient Fan Program (EEFP) in New Delhi. These initiatives were launched by the Union Minister for Power and New and Renewable Energy, Shri R. Of. Singh did it. These programs aim to bring about change in cooking practices in India and highlight the importance of energy-efficient fans. EESL's commitment towards these initiatives includes the distribution of 1 crore efficient BLDC fans and 20 lakh energy-efficient induction cook stoves across the country. NECP is set to transform cooking practices in India by introducing induction-based cook stoves, which offer a cost advantage of 25-30% compared to conventional cooking methods. The initiative promises both energy savings and cost-effective cooking solutions, making it an attractive option for Indian families. By deploying 20 lakh induction cook stoves across the country, EESL aims to reduce the environmental impact of cooking methods, ensure clean air and better health for citizens.

To facilitate this large-scale deployment, EESL has partnered with Modern Energy Cooking Services (MECS), which is expected to accelerate the acceptance and widespread adoption of modern electric cooking appliances in Indian kitchens. EEFP focuses on installation of energy-efficient BLDC fans with a target of distributing 1 crore ceiling fans across the country. These initiatives not only reduce energy consumption and environmental impact but also increase consumer convenience while reducing electricity bills. The program was launched during the G-20 Energy Transition Working Group in Goa in July 2023. As a continuation of this effort, EESL is inviting the first tender of 20 lakh fans under EEFP.

6. Bhutan King Wangchuk arrives in Delhi , will meet PM Modi



Bhutan King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck reached Delhi as part of his eight-day visit to India that began on November 3. He was warmly received by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar at the airport. This underlines the importance India is attaching to his visit. Wangchuk's visit to India comes amid renewed efforts by Bhutan and China for an early resolution of their decades-old border dispute. Wangchuk's visit to India is taking place at a time when Bhutan and China are emphasizing on quickly resolving the decades-old border dispute. India is closely monitoring the talks on the border dispute between Bhutan and China as it may impact India's security interests, especially at the Doklam tri-junction. Wangchuk's eight-day visit to India began from Guwahati on November 3. The Ministry of External Affairs had said on November 2 that

the visit of the Bhutanese King would provide an opportunity to both sides to review the entire dimension of bilateral cooperation and take forward bilateral partnership in various fields. Last month, Bhutan's Foreign Minister Tandi Dorji held talks with his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi in Beijing. A statement issued by China after the talks said Bhutan firmly supports the one-China principle and looks forward to working with China for an early resolution of the border issue and carrying forward the political process of establishing diplomatic relations. is ready. China and Bhutan had in August agreed to take rapid steps to implement a three-phase framework to resolve their border dispute.

7. IOC acquires Mercator Petroleum for Rs 148 crore



Public sector Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) has acquired Mercator Petroleum for about Rs 148 crore in insolvency proceedings. IOC said that the resolution plan of IOC for the acquisition of 100 per cent stake in Mercator Petroleum Limited (MPL) has been approved by the Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT). MPL has a terrestrial oil and gas exploration block in the Gulf of Khambhat, Gujarat. Block CB-ONN-2005/9 was won by the company in the 7th NELP bid in 2008. It is likely to have 4.55 crore barrels of oil reserves. This block is located at a distance of about 60 kilometers from IOC's Koyali Refinery Block. "The IOC will implement the resolution plan and complete the regulatory process, including obtaining necessary approvals, for the successful implementation of the resolution plan," it said. As per the resolution plan, the company will pay Rs 135 crore to secured financial creditors who had accepted claims of Rs 291 crore. No payment has been made to unsecured financial creditors, who had accepted claims of Rs 118 crore. Additionally, the resolution plan offers Rs 5.40 crore to operational creditors, including vendors, workmen, employees and statutory dues, while their total accepted claims are Rs 73 crore. IOC has also agreed to bear the insolvency proceedings cost of Rs 8.7 crore, demonstrating its commitment to ensure a smooth transition of MPL.

8. Indian poet Give Patel passes away at the age of 83



The world of art and literature lost an important figure with the demise of Give Patel at the Palliative Care and Training Centre, Pune. Give Patel, who is battling cancer, was admitted to the Pune center a few weeks ago. He leaves behind a legacy of notable contributions as a playwright, poet, painter and physician. Born on 18 August 1940 in Mumbai, Give Patel belonged to a family deeply involved in the medical profession. His father was a dentist, and his mother was a doctor's daughter. Patel received his early education at St. Xavier's High School and graduated from Grant Medical College, Mumbai. After his medical education, Patel initially took a government job in his native village Nargol in southern Gujarat. Subsequently, he served as a general practitioner in Mumbai until his retirement in 2005. Give Patel was not only a talented artist and poet but also an advocate of the environment. He was part of a group of writers who committed themselves to the green movement dedicated to environmental protection. His poems reflect deep concerns about nature and the consequences of human cruelty towards it. Some of his notable poems include "How Do You Withstand" (1966), "Body" (1976), "Mirrored Mirroring" (1991), and "On Killing a Tree." Apart from his poetic endeavours, Give Patel was a talented playwright. He wrote three plays, each of which highlights different aspects of the human experience. His plays, "Princess" (1971), "Savaxa" (1982), and "Mr. Behram" (1987) provided unique insights into the complexities of human

relationships and social issues. Patel's artistic explorations were not limited to the written word. He retired from his medical practice in 2005, after which he devoted himself entirely to the world of art. He was celebrated for his contributions to contemporary art, with a focus on the intricacies and beauty of life. His paintings often reflected the social realities of his time, running parallel to the leading painters of the Baroda School.
