

1. Rural retail inflation has been ahead of urban inflation in 18 out of 22 months



According to the latest data from the National Statistics Office, rural retail inflation has outpaced its urban counterpart in 18 of the last 22 months, from January 2022 to October 2023. As the central government continues its efforts to tackle economic challenges, recent data from the National Statistical Office (NSO) reveals a worrying trend in India's inflation dynamics. Despite initiatives such as the extended free-food program and ongoing efforts to stimulate rural demand, rural inflation has consistently been higher than urban inflation in 18 of the last 22 months, from January 2022 to October 2023. Over the reported period, rural retail inflation has maintained a higher trajectory than its urban counterpart, pointing to a persistent economic divide between rural and urban areas. The most recent NSO data released last week shows that the consumer price index-based (CPI-based) rural retail inflation rate has exceeded the urban inflation rate for the fourth consecutive month in October 2023. While the ruralurban inflation gap persisted for most of the time frame, there was a brief respite between March and June 2023 when rural retail inflation temporarily fell below urban inflation. However, this relief appears to be short-lived. In October 2023, rural inflation stood at 5.12%, showing a sustained upward trend in rural price levels. In contrast, urban inflation during the same period was recorded at 4.62%, highlighting the continuing disparity in inflation rates between rural and urban areas. Persistently high rural inflation raises questions about the effectiveness of the free-food program, designed to ease economic stress in rural areas. Despite ongoing efforts to stimulate rural demand, persistently high inflation in rural areas indicates that challenges remain in achieving sustained economic growth and demand in these areas.

2. Maharashtra government will give Lata Mangeshkar Award to Suresh Wadkar.



Maharashtra government has honored veteran playback singer and National Award winner Suresh Ishwar Wadkar with the prestigious 'Ganasamragini Lata Mangeshkar Award' for 2023. It was announced by Cultural Affairs Minister Sudhir Mungantiwar. Wadkar, 68, a Sangeet Natak Akademi (2018) winner, will be presented with a cash prize, a citation and a memento as part of the award at a function later, an official said. Hailing from a simple family from Kolhapur, Wadkar was a wrestler in his younger days and then became a music t<mark>ea</mark>cher in Mumbai <mark>before winnin</mark>g a singing competition in 1976, which gave him his first playback singing opportunity with the late music director Ravindra Jain in 1977. Got a chance. His early hit numbers were "Sona Kare Jhilmil Jhilmil" (Film 'Paheli'), "Seene Mein Jalan" ('Gaman'), which caught the attention of Lata Mangeshkar and she recommended him to other top musicians of that time. Apart from teaching music to the next generation, he sang songs in many Indian languages and in different styles. Mungantiwar also announced other major award winners in various categories, including Pandit Ulhas Kashalkar, Pandit Shashikant S. Mulye, Suhasini Deshpande, Ashok Samel, Naina Apte-Joshi, Pandit Makrand Kundle and others.

3. India-Sri Lanka joint military exercise 'Mitra Shakti' begins



The ninth edition of the joint military exercise between India and Sri Lanka began in Pune. During this exercise the focus will be on achieving high level coordination among the troops. The officers provided this information. Military exercise 'Mitra Shakti-2023' is being organized in Aundh, Pune from 16th to 29th November. The Indian contingent is being represented primarily by 120 soldiers from the Maratha Light Infantry Regiment, the Defense Ministry said. The Sri Lankan side is represented by soldiers of 53 Infantry Division. 15 soldiers of the Indian Air Force and five soldiers of the Sri Lankan Air Force are also participating in the exercise. The objective of the exercise is to jointly rehearse sub-conventional operations under Chapter Seven of the United Nations Charter. The scope of the exercise includes coordinating joint responses during counter-terrorism operations. Both sides will practice tactical operations like raids, search and destroy missions, heliborne operations etc. Apart from this, 'Army Martial Arts Routine (AMAR), Combat Reflex Shooting and Yoga are also part of the exercise. Apart from helicopters, the military exercise 'Mitra Shakti-2023' will also include the use of drones and unmanned anti-aircraft systems. Securing helipads and casualty evacuation during counter-terrorism operations will also be jointly practiced by both sides. Both sides will focus on achieving enhanced levels of interoperability between troops and reducing risk to life and property while keeping the interests and agenda of the United Nations at the forefront during collective peacekeeping operations. Officials said sharing of best practices will further enhance the level of defense cooperation between the Indian Army and the Sri Lankan Army. This exercise will also promote stronger bilateral relations between the two neighboring countries.

4. 'Amini' Indian Navy launches fourth anti-submarine warfare craft



Indian Navy launches Amini, its most sophisticated and state-of-the-art shallow water craft for anti-submarine warfare. The fourth of eight Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC) projects was named "Amini" It is said. It was started in Kattupalli, Tamil Nadu. Chief of Material Vice Admiral Sandeep Naithani conducted the launch ceremony. INS Amini, the fourth of the eight Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW SWC) being built for the Indian Navy by Defense PSU Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE), was launched. Amini was built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) Constructions for the Indian Navy. 'Amini' The name reflects the strategic maritime importance of Amini Island in Lakshadweep, located about 400 km west of Kochi. This, 77 meters long and displacement of 900 tonnes ASW SWC ships, has a maximum speed of 25 knots and an endurance of approximately 1800 nautical miles. CSL commenced the construction work of the project with steel-cutting of the first ASW-SWC vessel, Mahe (BY 523) at Kochi on December 1, 2020. GRSE began construction of two more boats under its contract with respective steelcutting ceremonies in July 2021. On December 1, 2021, CSL began steel-cutting of the fourth and fifth boats of the series. Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC) Corvette is a type of Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) vessel being developed for the Indian Navy. They were intended to replace the Indian Navy's aging Abhay-class corvettes. They are also intended to perform other functions such as minelaying, search and rescue, and defense against unauthorized aircraft (SAR). They will also conduct anti-submarine operations in coastal waters as well as LIMO and mine laying missions.

8. India may continue to enforce the ban on rice exports further



India, a major global exporter of rice, is likely to extend the ban on foreign sales until next year. The decision is set to keep rice prices near their highest levels since the 2008 food crisis. The impact of the ongoing ban on rice exports will put further pressure on prices in the global market. Anyway, after the ban on rice export last month, prices have reached the highest level in 15 years. Low prices and ample reserves have helped India become a top shipper of rice globally over the past decade. India alone currently exports about 40 per cent of total global exports. African countries Benin and Senegal top the list of largest rice buyers from India. The PM Modi-led government is likely to continue to tighten restrictions on rice exports to curb rising domestic prices and provide relief to Indian consumers. The restrictions are likely to remain in place as long as domestic rice prices continue to face upward pressure. The ban pushed rice prices to a 15-year high in August, as buyers in the most vulnerable importing countries halted purchases and some sought rebates. Rice prices in October were also 24% ahead of a year earlier, the UN report said. The arrival of El Nino destroys crops throughout Asia. This could further tighten the global rice market at a time when world reserves are headed for a third consecutive annual decline. The Thai government has said that due to dry weather, paddy production in the number-2 exporting country is likely to decline by 6 percent in 2023-24. In such a situation, after India, Thailand can also cut exports, due to which huge pressure can be seen on the prices of rice in the global market.
