



1. Nippon Life India AIF preparing to raise ₹1,000 crore for private loan expansion



Nippon Life India AIF entered Mumbai's financial scene by raising Rs 1,000 crore from high-net-worth investors. In the dynamic financial landscape of Mumbai, Nippon Life India Asset Management has strategically entered the private lending space, keeping pace with the changing trends following regulatory tightening by banks and move away from promoter funding by mutual funds. The move echoes similar initiatives by Centrum and Avendus. Nippon Life India Alternative Investment Fund aims to raise a substantial Rs 1,000 crore targeting investors such as high net worth individuals and family offices. Having already invested Rs 100 crore in two strategic deals, the fund is set to go ahead with the green shoe option to secure an additional Rs 1,000 crore. With credit mutual funds freeing up space, Nippon has identified an opportune moment to step in to focus on growth capital to meet the needs of equity-starved promoters seeking expansion. The exit of private equity from India's public markets has resulted in a pipeline of stagnant stressed assets, accelerating demand for private debt. Nippon aims to invest between Rs 50 crore and Rs 100 crore per deal, with an emphasis on an average maturity of 2.5 to 3 years. The fund adopts a prudent approach with amortization a key component in its investment strategy. Nippon's strategy revolves around a concentrated portfolio focusing on 10-12 securities. The fund primarily targets non-bank end use within the 'BBB' to 'A' rating spectrum while balancing risk and return dynamics. Ashish Chuglani, head of alternative investments at Nippon Life India AIF, envisions midteens returns of 14-15% from selected securities. With a promising pipeline, the fund anticipates three upcoming investments, demonstrating a commitment to continued growth in the private credit sector.

2. Dutch elections: Geert Wilders aims to become prime minister after unexpected victory



The surprise victory of far-right leader Geert Wilders in the Dutch elections signals a European transformation. While advocating anti-immigration and sentiments, Wilders faces challenges in implementing radical ideas. In a surprising turn of events, Freedom Party (PVV) leader Geert Wilders won a historic victory in the recent Dutch elections, signaling a growing shift towards far-right ideologies in Europe. Wilders, known for his anti-immigration stance and praise of leaders like Donald Trump and Viktor Orbán, is eyeing the position of next prime minister of the Netherlands. Wilders' victory serves as a warning to mainstream parties across Europe, setting the stage for the upcoming European Parliament elections. The prevailing issues of immigration, cost of living and climate change are expected to dominate the political discussion. While Wilders advocates a return to Dutch values and expresses anti-Islam and anti-EU sentiments, radical aspects of his agenda, such as leaving the EU or banning the Quran, would face strong opposition from potential coalition partners. Is. Geert Wilders aims to prioritize a significant reduction in asylum and immigration, reflecting the concerns of a portion of Dutch citizens. The increase in net migration, which reached approximately 223,000 people in 2022, has increased calls for stricter immigration policies. Wilders also expresses support for a referendum on the Netherlands' EU membership. Analysts see Wilders' victory as an expression of the public's dissatisfaction with the political establishment, particularly addressing issues such as the housing market crisis and migration. This is referred to as an "anti-establishment signal" rather than purely anti-EU or anti-Islam sentiment.

3. RBI included PM Vishwakarma Yojana in PIDF



Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das said that it has been decided to include PM Vishwakarma under the Payment Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) scheme and to extend the scheme by two years. Announcing the bi-monthly monetary policy, the Governor said that it is now proposed to extend the PIDF scheme for a period of two years i.e. till December 31, 2025. The scheme was started in January, 2021. The scheme is aimed at accepting payments through Point of Sale (POS), Quick Response (QR) codes in small and sparsely populated urban areas (Tier-3 to Tier-6), North-Eastern States and Union Territories like Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. To establish access to the infrastructure. Under the original plan, the PIDF scheme was brought for three years till December 2023. Governor Das said that the beneficiaries of PM Swanidhi Scheme in Tier-1 and Tier-2 areas were included in the PIDF scheme in August, 2021. More than 2.66 crore new 'touch points' have been deployed under the scheme by the end of August 2023. Das said, "Now there is a proposal to extend the PIDF scheme for two years i.e. till December 31, 2025. Also, there is a proposal to include the beneficiaries of PM Vishwakarma Yojana in all the centers under the PIDF scheme. Das said that this decision to expand the targeted beneficiaries under the PIDF scheme will boost the Reserve Bank's efforts towards promoting digital transactions at the grassroots level. He said, "Based on the feedback received from the industry, it is proposed to encourage the deployment of emerging methods of payment acceptance, such as soundbox devices and Aadhaar-enabled biometric devices, under the PIDF scheme. This is expected to further accelerate the deployment of payments infrastructure in targeted geographies.

4. UAE inaugurates world's largest solar power plant



The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has inaugurated the world's largest single-site solar power plant, the 2gigawatt (GW) Al Dhafra Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Independent Power Project (IPP). The plant, located 35 kilometers from downtown Abu Dhabi, will generate enough electricity to power approximately 200,000 homes and is expected to displace 2.4 million tonnes of carbon emissions annually. The project was inaugurated by Sheikh Hazza bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Ruler of Abu Dhabi, and stressed the importance of the plant as a symbol of progress in solar energy efficiency, innovation and cost competitiveness. Dr. Sultan bin Ahmed Al Jaber, COP28 President-designate, Minister of Industry and Advanced Technology and Chairman of Masdar, highlighted the importance of Al Dhafra as a reflection of the UAE's ongoing commitment to clean energy. The project broke records in terms of cost for utility-scale solar projects. Initially, the project led to the most competitive tariff for solar power being set at AED 4.97 fils/kWh (US\$ 1.35 cents/kWh), which was reduced to AED 4.85 fils/kWh (US\$ 1.32 cents/kWh) at financial closing.) was improved. The opening of Al Dhafra Solar PV marks an important step towards the UAE's clean energy transition. The country has set ambitious targets to triple renewable capacity and double energy efficiency by 2030, with Al Dhafra serving as a model for global ambition in clean energy initiatives. The project is in line with the UAE's Net Zero 2050 target, strengthening its leadership in solar energy production on a per capita basis. The project is also a testament to the UAE's commitment to hosting a successful COP28. The country will host the United Nations Climate

Change Conference from November 30 to December 12 this year.

5. World's first 3D printed temple unveiled in Siddipet near Hyderabad



In a remarkable feat of architectural innovation, a 3D printed temple has been unveiled in Siddipet, Telangana, claiming to be the world's first of its kind. The temple, a joint venture between Hyderabad Apsuja Infratech and additive manufacturing solutions provider SimplyForge Creations, was built using state-of-the-art 3D printing technology and took about three months to complete. Standing at an impressive height of 35.5 feet and spread over an area of 4,000 square feet, the temple is made up of three separate sanctums. The first is a modak-shaped sanctum that is dedicated to Lord Ganesha, followed by a square-shaped pagoda that is dedicated to Lord Shankar, and finally, a lotus-shaped sanctum that is dedicated to Goddess Parvati. SimplyForge successfully 3D printed three gopurams (shikharas) and sanctums at the site within a period of 70-90 days using its state-of-the-art robotics manufacturing 3D printing facility. Their achievement was possible through the use of home-developed systems, indigenous materials and state-of-the-art software. The remaining components of the temple, including pillars, slabs and floors, were constructed using traditional construction techniques. Overall the construction of the entire temple was completed in five and a half months. Expressing pride in the temple, Amit Ghule, COO, SimplyForge, emphasized that it has the distinction of being not only India's but the world's first 3D printed temple. Ghule further explained that this pioneering construction project demonstrates SimpliForge's ability to address structural requirements,

temple design principles and the challenges associated with on-site construction, as reported by The Times of India. Ghule also said possible future applications of SimpliForge's robust systems in challenging terrain, disaster-stricken areas and defense sectors, including inaccessible areas such as frontier areas, high altitude areas, deserts and snowy areas.


6. Best Actor Award for Ishvak Singh at Stars Asian International Film Festival


