

3. Pakistani all-rounder Imad Wasim retired



Pakistan's all-rounder Imad Wasim put a break on his eight-year long international cricket career. Wasim, who played a total of 121 matches for Pakistan including ODI and T-20, was out of the team for a long time. He was considered a vocal opponent of captain Babar Azam. Imad played his last match in T-20 format against New Zealand in Rawalpindi in April this year. Born on 18 December 1988 in the UK, Wasim made his international cricket debut in a T-20 match against Zimbabwe in Lahore in May 2015. Left-handed batsman Wasim scored 986 runs in 55 ODIs at an average of 42.86 and took 44 wickets with his left-arm spin. In 66 T20Is, Wasim scored 486 runs and took 65 wickets. However, Wasim said that now he wants to focus on franchise format cricket.' Imad has been a key member of the Pakistan team for many years and was part of the 2017 Champions Trophy-winning team. He also played in the 2016 T20 World Cup, 2019 World Cup and 2021 T20 World Cup.

4. Agreement between Integrated Defense Staff and CSIR for joint research in defense technology



Integrated Defense Staff and Council of Scientific and Industrial Research signed an MoU for joint research in defense technology. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was officially signed between Headquarters, Integrated Defense Staff (HQ IDS) and Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR). Focused on technical cooperation, joint research and development in the field of defense technology, this agreement is set to have a significant impact on India's defense capabilities. The MOU ceremony, which is a testament to the commitment of both the institutions. The MoU ceremony included the signatures of the following: Lieutenant General JP Mathew, Chief of Integrated Defense Staff to the Chairman Chiefs of Staff Committee (CISC), Ministry of Defense (MoD), and N. Kalaiselvi, Director General, CSIR and Secretary, Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR), Ministry of Science and Technology (MOST). The MoU establishes a comprehensive framework to promote collaborative interaction between CSIR Labs, HQ IDS and the Indian Armed Forces including the Indian Army, Indian Navy and Indian Air Force. The primary goal is to enhance scientific understanding of defence-related technologies and to conduct joint research and development in the area of dual-use technologies. The Defense Ministry underlined the common interests shared by HQ IDS and CSIR in pursuing joint research and development in defense technologies. This collaboration is rooted in the shared vision of 'Scientific Cooperation in Support of the Indian Armed Forces'. The partnership is designed to achieve mutual benefits by leveraging the strengths and expertise of both entities. By pooling resources and knowledge, HQ IDS and CSIR aim to advance defense technologies for the collective benefit of the Armed Forces. This collaborative effort is aligned with the overarching national goal of achieving 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' – a self-reliant India. The strategic partnership is

likely to accelerate indigenization efforts of the armed forces, promote autonomy and self-reliance in defense capabilities.

5. India announces launch of biogas blending for domestic use



India will start blending compressed biogas with natural gas to boost domestic demand and cut dependence on natural gas imports, the government said in a statement. A mandatory phase-out for use in automobiles and homes will begin at 1% from April 2025. The share of mandatory blending will be increased to about 5% by 2028. India is one of the world's largest importers of oil and gas, shipping almost half of its total gas consumption and is looking to cut its import costs. The government aims to have 1% sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) in aircraft turbine fuel by 2027, which will double to 2% in 2028. SAF targets will initially apply to international flights. These steps are aimed at helping India achieve net zero emissions target by 2070. India, a major global importer of oil and gas, currently sources about half of its total gas consumption from external suppliers. By implementing the biogas blending initiative, the government aims to reduce import costs and increase energy self-reliance.

6. Agreement between India and European Union to make semiconductors



An agreement for semiconductor manufacturing was signed between India and the European Union. This agreement was agreed after the virtual meeting of India and European Union Trade and Technology Council (TTC). In this meeting, India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, Railways, Communications, Information and Technology Minister Ashwani Vaishnav and Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal represented the Indian team. India is in talks with many strategic partner countries for cooperation in semiconductor manufacturing. This is also being discussed under the Quad organization but for the first time India has signed an agreement with a strategic partner with the European Union. India and EU will share their experiences on semiconductor ecosystem. The India and European Union Trade and Technology Council (TTC) was formed in the meeting between PM Narendra Modi and European Union President Ursula Bonne Leyen in April 2022. The first meeting of the India and EU Trade and Technology Council was held in Brussels in May 2023. Several working groups have been formed under the India and EU Trade and Technology Council (TTC). This working group has also prepared a roadmap for technology cooperation between India and the EU. After semiconductors, discussions are now going on for cooperation in cutting edge industries like high capacity computers, EV batteries etc. According to this agreement, both the parties will make a common strategy in the manufacturing of hundreds of different equipment related to it. The Trade and Technology Council is expected to meet in India in early 2024, the EU said in a statement. It is also expected to facilitate cooperation through talent, workforce development, workshops, organization of partnerships and promotion of direct investment for the semiconductor industry.

The EU has said the agreement will ensure a level playing field in the semiconductor sector, including sharing information on public subsidies granted.

7. Afghanistan permanently closed its embassy in India



Afghanistan has recently announced the permanent closure of its Delhi-based embassy. At the same time, the heads of its Mumbai and Hyderabad missions have claimed to take over the leadership of the embassy. The embassy had announced on September 30 that it was closing its operations from October 1. The mission then cited lack of support from the Indian government, failure to serve Afghanistan's interests and meet expectations, and shortage of personnel and resources. Issuing a statement, the embassy said that it regrets to announce the permanent closure of its diplomatic mission in New Delhi with effect from November 23 due to continued challenges from the Government of India. The decision further follows the embassy's decision to cease operations on September 30, the statement further said. This step was taken in the hope that the attitude of the Government of India would change favorably to allow the mission to operate normally. The Afghan Embassy said, unfortunately, despite a wait of eight weeks, the objectives of extension of visas for diplomats and change in the conduct of the Indian government could not be achieved. Faced with continued pressure from both the Taliban and the Indian government to relinquish control, the embassy had to make a difficult choice. However, Zakia Wardak, Consul General of Afghanistan in Mumbai and Syed Mohammad Ibrahimkhil, Acting Consul General in Hyderabad, announced in a statement that in view of the friendly relations between India and Afghanistan, they reiterate that they have extended their support to

the Embassy in New Delhi. It has been decided to ensure continuous functioning. Both diplomats said they have taken over the leadership of the Afghanistan embassy in New Delhi. Wardak and Ibrahimkhil requested everyone to ignore and disregard the unprofessional and irresponsible communications issued by former Afghan diplomats, saying they have no right to interfere in the internal affairs of the Afghan Embassy in New Delhi.

8. Navy, Coast Guard will buy 15 C-295 aircraft for maritime surveillance



Acquisition of 15 C-295 transport aircraft is on the horizon for the Indian Coast Guard and Navy, with the Navy considering nine aircraft and the Indian Coast Guard keen to purchase six aircraft. Taking a significant step towards enhancing self-reliance in the defense sector, the Indian Coast Guard and Navy are set to acquire 15 C-295 transport aircraft. Acquisition proposals are currently in the advanced stage within the Defense Ministry, with the Navy eyeing nine aircraft and the Indian Coast Guard planning to buy six aircraft. The C-295 transport aircraft is being manufactured in India through a collaborative effort between Tata Advanced Systems and Airbus. This collaboration not only strengthens the country's defense capabilities but also promotes indigenous manufacturing and technological expertise. This aircraft will play an important role in maritime operations in line with the strategic objectives of the Indian Armed Forces. The acquired transport aircraft will be equipped with state-of-the-art radars and sensors, which will be converted into maritime patrol aircraft by the Center for Airborne Systems (CABS) of the Defense Research and Development Organisation. This upgrade will enhance the surveillance and reconnaissance capabilities of the Indian Armed

Forces, especially in the maritime areas. Indian Coast Guard Chief Director General Rakesh Pal stressed on plans to acquire long-range maritime surveillance aircraft, with a contract set to be signed with Tata Advanced Systems Ltd for six C-295 transport aircraft. The support of the Ministry of Defense in expediting the acquisition processes reflects the government's dedication to enhancing national security. In addition to the C-295 transport aircraft, the Indian Coast Guard is set to sign contracts for nine advanced-light helicopters, notably the ALH Dhruv manufactured by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited. These acquisitions indicate a comprehensive modernization plan, encompassing a range of advanced and indigenous platforms to meet various operational requirements. If the proposed order of 15 C-295 aircraft is approved by the government, it will increase the Tata Airbus order book from the current 56 to a total of 71. It symbolizes the continued cooperation and trust between the two entities and underlines the success of the joint ventures in advancing the country's defense manufacturing capabilities.
